20. SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY — HOW TO CHECK YOUR 5-MILE RADIUS

The Pennsylvania State Police Megan’s Law site is the **only authoritative source** for registrant status in PA. Third-party aggregator sites are routinely outdated and are not a substitute. Registry data is offender-reported and changes continuously—a snapshot printed in this report would be stale within days. This section gives you the procedure to run the live search whenever you need it. Recommend running the radius check **quarterly** and signing up for the free email-notification service below.

Procedure — 5-mile radius search from your home

1. Go to meganslaw.psp.pa.gov.
2. Accept the *Terms and Conditions* page (state-mandated; data may not be used to threaten, intimidate, or harass).
3. From the **Search Offenders** menu, choose **Address Search** (radius search by street address).
4. Enter your home street address (Thomasville). Set radius to **5 miles**. Submit.
5. Results return registrant photo, year of birth, current address, employment/school address (if applicable), and offense of conviction. Click any pin on the map for the same detail. Repeat the search for school addresses, rally points, and other locations of interest.
6. Sign up for **Email Notification** for ongoing alerts on a 5-mile radius around up to 5 saved addresses (home, workplace, school, rally points, family residences).

Caveats and lawful use

- Registry data is offender-reported. PSP states it may be outdated or inaccurate; the registry is not a comprehensive list of every person who has committed a sexual offense.
- Use information for situational awareness only. Per 42 Pa.C.S. § 9799.28 and PSP terms, using registry data to threaten, intimidate, or harass registrants or their families is a crime and can carry civil liability. Take reasonable precautions; do not act as a vigilante.
- Only Sexually Violent Predators (SVPs) are subject to community notification (door-to-door flyers, school notification). Tier I–III registrants are searchable but are not actively pushed to neighbors—you must run the search.
- To verify identity definitively, PSP states the only positive method is fingerprint comparison. Photographs and addresses on the public site are descriptive only.
- If you have a reasonable belief that registry information is incorrect or someone is non-compliant, contact the PSP Megan’s Law Section toll-free at **1-866-771-3170**.

21. GANG ACTIVITY — COUNTY-LEVEL THREAT ENVIRONMENT

Why this section is reported by county, not by 50-mile radius. The rest of this ASAR uses a 50-mile radius because the assets it covers (PSAPs, hospitals, NWR transmitters, repeaters) have geometric coverage—a tower’s footprint, an ED’s drive time, a PSAP’s dispatch boundary. **Gang activity does not have a geometric footprint.** It is reported, prosecuted, and tracked by the agencies that own jurisdictions—county DAs, county drug task forces, and the U.S. Attorney’s Office for the Middle District of PA. NGIC, FBI, and PA OAG threat assessments are county-tiered. The natural unit of analysis is therefore the **county**. Scope of this section: York (primary) plus Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, and Lancaster (immediate surrounding). Franklin and the three Maryland counties at the southern edge of the AOR are out of scope here—their gang environment belongs to different reporting structures (PA OAG Western Region; Maryland Coordination & Analysis Center).

Purpose. Situational awareness. Knowing which sets are active and what their identifiers look like helps you read your environment—graffiti as territorial marking, colors at a gathering, social-media indicators. It is not a tool for confrontation. Identifiers below are at the bulletin/awareness level only; deeper indicators are law-enforcement-sensitive and intentionally not published. Where the public record shows no documented street-gang activity, the table says so—no padding.

Outlaw motorcycle gangs (OMGs) — AOR relevance

OMGs do not map cleanly to county boundaries; they operate by chapter geography (clubhouses, riding territory, supply networks). Pennsylvania—and central PA in particular—is core territory for the **Pagans MC**. Per the 2020 USAO Western District of PA federal RICO presser, the Pagans are one of the “big four” OMGs in the United States and the **only major OMG based solely in the United States**. Their thirteen-member “mother club” leadership has historically been based in central Pennsylvania. Hells Angels presence in eastern PA is reduced since their Philadelphia chapter closed in ~2005 following the Schuylkill Expressway killing of their VP. The Philadelphia Warlocks (distinct from the Florida Warlocks) maintain eastern-PA presence with multiple federal cases on record.

Operational note. Most 1%er-on-civilian violence is incidental, not targeted—a bystander caught in an inter-club confrontation or a confrontation triggered by perceived disrespect (cutting off a pack on a run, photographing colors). The defensive posture is simple: don't intervene in club business, don't photograph colors at a gathering, don't wear colors or patches that could be read as a rival's, and give a riding pack the road. Specific clubhouse locations and run schedules in the AOR are not published here—they change, and printing them would either be stale within months or risk steering a curious reader toward trouble.

Antigovernment / ideological extremism — AOR relevance

Different threat type, same situational-awareness logic. The FBI classifies the **sovereign citizens movement** as a domestic terrorist threat, with the highest documented risk being directed at law enforcement during traffic stops, courthouse encounters, and home contact. Pennsylvania has confirmed cases in the AOR's direct vicinity: in March 2024, sovereign Curtis Gregory Smith Jr. of **Middletown, Dauphin County** (within the 50-mi AOR), was sentenced to up to 56 years for felon-in-possession of multiple firearms, body armor, and large quantities of military-grade ammunition. Earlier FBI Philadelphia cases targeted sovereigns in Delaware County PA. Six PA-related sovereign-citizen incidents are tracked in 2024 alone in open-source counts.

Operational note. Many indicators in this table—Gadsden flag, Iron Cross, Norse runes, “Don’t Tread on Me,” even “Molon Labe”—are also used by people with no extremist affiliation. **Treat any single indicator as a prompt to look at context, not as identification by itself.** The actual operational risk indicators are pseudolegal documents arriving in the mail (paper terrorism), refusal to engage with normal jurisdiction at a traffic stop or on a doorstep, and unsolicited approaches at preparedness or community-defense events that try to recruit toward action rather than awareness. If something feels off, log it and report it—don’t engage further.
