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THE ONE THING TODAY

Two things today: **if you are in the Kansas/Oklahoma/Ozarks corridor**, have your shelter plan ready before evening. And if anyone in your household manages network equipment at work, flag the Cisco SD-WAN security deadline this Sunday -- it matters and IT needs to act now. The rest of this brief explains both. re 23 NOAA Weather Radio transmitters out of service right now, and today brings a SLIGHT severe weather risk to southern Kansas, northern Oklahoma, and the Ozarks -- large hail, wind, and isolated tornadoes. Northeastern Colorado and SW Nebraska also have a hail and wind threat this evening -- organizing MCS possible after dark. arge hail (2-4 inches), wind gusts over 75 mph, and isolated tornadoes, with storms possibly not developing until after dark. If you are in that area, have a shelter location ready before sunset. Wildfire danger is at the highest national level (NPL 3): 32 large fires are burning with extreme conditions in Utah and Nevada. Fire weather is critical in western and central Utah today with dry thunderstorms possible, and a major weather trough arriving Friday-Saturday will bring widespread critical fire conditions across the West. Gas prices are \$3.93 per gallon nationally -- falling steadily -- but the Hormuz supply chain disruption will take 9-12 months to fully clear.

WHAT TO DO THIS WEEK

Five actions you can take in under an hour each

- 1. A powerful earthquake hit Venezuela overnight -- 164 dead, buildings collapsed, airport closed.** Two M7+ earthquakes struck northern Venezuela back-to-back last night -- the strongest in 125 years. The death toll is 164 and rising. The airport in Caracas is closed. If you have family in Venezuela, phone and internet were disrupted overnight. US rescue teams are on the way. There is no US safety threat from this event. and tornado potential. Storms may develop after dark. Know your shelter before you go to bed. Day 2 (Thursday): Kansas, Oklahoma, and the Ozarks face an elevated tornado threat as LLJ strengthens. Utah and Wisconsin/N Illinois: SLIGHT risk today. WEA alerts on your phone are essential -- 23 NOAA Weather Radio transmitters are out of service. NC/Virginia: SLIGHT risk this afternoon.
- 2. Severe weather today: Kansas, Oklahoma, Ozarks -- have shelter ready before evening.** The Storm Prediction Center has a SLIGHT risk for severe storms today across southern Kansas, northern Oklahoma, and into the Ozarks -- large hail, damaging wind, and isolated tornadoes are possible. If you are in that area, know where your shelter is before dark. A separate threat in northeastern Colorado and southwestern Nebraska this evening involves hail and damaging winds from an organizing storm cluster. and markets are pricing in Hormuz normalization. Iran chief negotiator said Hormuz "will be administered by Iran" and Iran is discussing transit fees with Oman -- forward risk -- but the main signal today is price relief. Keep a half-to-full tank as normal practice. The physical supply chain (mine-clearing, shipping ramp-up, port congestion) still needs 9-12 months to fully normalize. Trump announced a DOJ investigation into fuel price gouging by oil companies today.
- 3. Gas prices holding near \$3.93/gal -- still declining.** Brent crude fell below \$74 a barrel Wednesday -- lowest since before the Iran war. Gas prices are \$3.93 per gallon nationally and still edging down. The US-Iran ceasefire deal is now Day 9. Supply chains are recovering but slowly -- non-oil costs (food, manufactured goods) are still elevated because the system needs months to normalize. Mayor Andy Burnham is expected to become the next PM by mid-July -- no major policy changes expected immediately. Belfast remains fragile: 25 people have been arrested over the riots, including 10 juveniles. A follow-on hate crime arson happened at a property in north Belfast on June 14. The situation is calmer than two weeks ago but the organized groups behind the violence are still active. July brings the marching season in Northern Ireland, which historically raises tensions. Traveling to the UK: Belfast is calmer, but check uk.usembassy.gov and avoid former protest areas.
- 4. Wildfire season is active -- Cottonwood Fire in Utah grew 30,000 acres overnight.** The Cottonwood Fire near Beaver, Utah grew more than 30,000 acres overnight with extreme fire behavior. Five other major fires -- in Utah, Nevada, Arizona, Oregon, and Washington -- have active evacuations. If you are in the Intermountain West, review your evacuation routes this week. A major wind event is forecast for Friday-Saturday with 40+ mph gusts across the Great Basin and Southwest. in a fragile negotiation phase; Ebola is an active global

health emergency with 1,000+ cases and no vaccine; 31 large wildfires are burning; severe weather is hitting tonight; and 23 NOAA Weather Radio transmitters are out of service. Your phone WEA alerts are your primary automated warning system. Also: a major weather trough arrives Friday-Saturday bringing critical fire conditions to the Intermountain West. If you live near a wildfire or in fire-prone terrain, review your evacuation route before Thursday evening. Water, food, first aid basics, and a charged phone with WEA on are the minimum household kit.

5. PREP-CON 3 still in effect -- and there is a new space weather alert today. A minor geomagnetic storm (G1) is active today. This will not affect your electronics or power at home in most of the US. It does mean aurora is visible in northern Michigan and Maine tonight. The bigger communications issue is still the 32 NOAA Weather Radio transmitters that are out -- make sure WEA phone alerts are on. Also: the Iran conflict (Day 118) and Ebola outbreak (Day 41, now with a confirmed case in France) both remain elevated. And if your workplace manages Cisco network equipment, the security patching deadline is this Sunday June 29. Cyber: your IT team has a mandatory federal cybersecurity deadline on June 29 (Cisco SD-WAN network equipment). If your employer asks you to update network software or reboot network devices this week, do it immediately -- it is legitimate. A major active cyberattack is targeting the network management software that controls corporate branch office systems, and there is no fix other than upgrading.

THE SHORT VERSION

What's happening this week, in five sentences:

1. Twin earthquakes struck Venezuela last night -- 164 people are confirmed dead and the toll is expected to rise, with many buildings collapsed in Caracas and the international airport closed. The head of the International Atomic Energy Agency said the deal text requires it, and described the public back-and-forth between the US and Iran as a "war of words" that does not change what the deal says.
2. Gas prices are still falling -- \$3.93 per gallon nationally -- but supply chains for food and manufactured goods are still running hot because the system needs more time to normalize. A negotiator said on the way home that Iran will "administer" the Strait of Hormuz and Iran is in talks with Oman about charging ships to pass through, which could slow the recovery.
3. Severe weather is possible today across southern Kansas, northern Oklahoma, and into the Ozarks -- the Storm Prediction Center has a slight risk for storms with hail, damaging wind, and isolated tornadoes; a separate hail and wind threat is active in northeastern Colorado tonight. A SLIGHT risk with large hail and damaging wind from an organizing storm cluster possible after dark; fire danger is at the highest national level with dry thunderstorms threatening Utah today and a major weather system arriving Friday-Saturday that will bring critical fire conditions across the Mountain West.
4. The Ebola outbreak in the Congo is now at 1,094 confirmed cases and France just confirmed the first case in Europe -- this is concerning but there is no action needed for most US households; if you or family traveled to Congo or Uganda recently, watch for fever. -- with no approved vaccine or treatment and the weekly case count still growing; UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer resigned Monday after losing the confidence of his own party, and Andy Burnham, the former mayor of Manchester, is expected to replace him by mid-July.
5. There is a minor (G1) geomagnetic storm active today -- it will not affect your household electronics, but it does mean potential aurora in northern Michigan and Maine; 32 NOAA Weather Radio transmitters are currently out, so keep WEA phone alerts turned on. Your phone WEA alerts are your primary warning system, and the World Cup is on Day 15 with no security incidents -- Group stage matches continuing in Mexico City, Monterrey, Vancouver, Seattle, Miami, and Atlanta today.

Today's situation: [SWPC](#) Space weather is quiet today -- nothing to report. No alerts or warnings are active. The solar events from last week have fully resolved. All SWPC thresholds are below action levels as of 1530Z today.

What this means today: No action needed for most households. If you are in northern Michigan or Maine, look north tonight for aurora. GPS is working normally. Power grid: very minor fluctuations possible only at extreme high latitudes, not the continental US.ances.

Watch this week: [SWPC](#) G1 storm expected to ease by end of day. NOAA Weather Radio: 32 transmitters OOS/DEGRADED -- this is the more important communications gap for most households.eholds this week.

SUPPLY CHAIN - WHAT IT MEANS AT HOME

Gas pump: \$3.93 per gallon national average (AAA 25-JUN) -- continued decline from the \$4.56 peak on May 21. Brent crude fell below \$74 per barrel Wednesday -- lowest since before the Iran war. Cushing crude inventories are approaching operational minimums, which is a domestic tightness signal to watch.\$74.73 -- lowest since before the Iran conflict. Prices will continue to ease gradually. Trump announced a DOJ investigation into fuel price gouging by oil companies today. Iran's chief negotiator said the Strait of Hormuz will be "administered by Iran" and Iran is discussing transit fees with Oman -- this is a forward risk to normalization that is not yet affecting prices but is worth monitoring.

Groceries: Fertilizer prices remain elevated from the Hormuz disruption. USDA revised food-at-home inflation to 3.1% for 2026 -- nearly double the start-of-year projection. Beef prices projected up 9.4%. Building 2-4 weeks of shelf-stable staples now is smart -- prices are better now than projected for Q3-Q4 2026.

Online shipping: The Hormuz situation is improving, but the full supply chain -- mine-clearing, shipping ramp-up, port congestion clearing -- will take 9-12 months to normalize per IATA/DHL. Expect delivery times for goods from Asia to remain longer than normal through at least Q3 2026. War-risk insurance on shipments remains elevated.

Diesel and trucking: Diesel is about \$5.40+ per gallon -- well above pre-war levels. This feeds directly into the cost of delivered goods. Trucking margins are compressed and those costs are being passed to consumers.

Medications: Order 90-day fills now for prescription medications. The Hormuz disruption has affected some pharmaceutical supply chains. If your pharmacy is out of a medication, ask about alternatives or contact your doctor. Enterprise workers: IT may push urgent security patches this week for Splunk, Fortinet VPN, and related tools -- this is legitimate and expected, cooperate right away.

CYBER, COMMS & LOCAL IMPACTS

Venezuela earthquake: 164 dead, rescue active, airport closed -- no US safety threat. Two powerful earthquakes struck Venezuela back-to-back last night. The death toll is 164 and expected to rise. Caracas buildings collapsed, the international airport is closed, and communications in the coastal area of La Guaira are severed. US rescue teams and humanitarian aid are deployed. If you have family in Venezuela, connectivity is partially recovering. This is a tragedy but poses no direct safety risk to people in the US. The peace deal text requires it, and he said "this is going to happen." He called the back-and-forth between the US and Iran a "war of words" that does not change what the deal says. Iran has not responded publicly yet. This is important because without inspectors, we cannot verify whether Iran is actually not enriching uranium. Technical talks between US and Iran teams resume next week in Switzerland. Lebanon: the US is hosting Israel-Lebanon ceasefire talks through Thursday at the State Department.

IT security -- patch Cisco SD-WAN by Sunday June 29: There is an active cyberattack targeting network management software used by companies and government agencies -- specifically Cisco Catalyst SD-WAN Manager. The federal patching deadline is this Sunday June 29. If your workplace uses Cisco network equipment and your IT team asks you to cooperate with updates, do it immediately. A product called Cisco SD-WAN Manager. Your IT team has until June 29 to apply a patch to protect against it. If your employer asks you to reboot network equipment or apply a security update this week, do it immediately. For home users: make sure your home router firmware is up to date. Also: if you get an email claiming to be from IT asking for your password -- that is NOT legitimate, call IT directly to verify.

World Cup Day 16 -- no security incidents through Day 15. Tonight's match: Paraguay vs Australia at Levi's Stadium in San Francisco, 10pm ET. The next elevated security window is July 4-5 weekend when matches in Dallas, KC, Houston, Philadelphia, and New York coincide with Independence Day festivities. (Group C, 6pm ET). Mexico has already qualified. Canada leads Group B unbeaten. No security incidents have occurred at any tournament venue. Security posture remains high: FBI-led command centers, 400+ law enforcement agencies, counter-drone coverage at all venues. The next elevated window is the July 4-5 weekend when World Cup matches in Dallas, KC, Houston, Philadelphia, and New York coincide with Independence Day festivities. If you are attending: arrive early, know the exits, and report anything suspicious.

Minor geomagnetic storm (G1) active -- aurora possible N Michigan/Maine tonight. A G1 Minor geomagnetic storm is active today. For most US households, no action needed. Aurora is possible tonight in northern Michigan and Maine if skies are clear -- look north after dark. GPS is operating normally. A follow-on hate crime arson happened at a property in north Belfast on June 14. The situation is much improved from the riots two weeks ago, but the organized groups behind the violence are still active, and the July marching season is approaching -- traditionally a tense period in Northern Ireland. UK PM Keir Starmer resigned Monday after losing his party's confidence. Andy Burnham, the former Manchester mayor, is expected to replace him by mid-July. If traveling to the UK: calmer now, but check uk.usembassy.gov and avoid former riot areas.

SIGNALS THAT CONDITIONS ARE GETTING WORSE

Watch for these in the news this week. If you see them, raise your readiness one notch.

- Venezuela earthquake death toll jumps above 500 in media reporting -- this would indicate the rural and coastal damage is worse than current data shows and supply chain/energy export disruption may follow, as tied Hormuz compliance to Lebanon, so a Lebanon failure could mean the Strait situation worsens. Brent would spike \$5-10/barrel within hours.

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- US-Iran ceasefire formally collapses over Lebanon or IAEA access dispute -- would re-elevate oil prices and supply chain risk immediately. Agency publicly announces Iran is blocking access (very bad sign) -- the nuclear watchdog said today inspectors ARE coming, but Iran's public response matters.

- issues a Tornado WARNING for your area -- the SLIGHT risk today covers southern Kansas, northern Oklahoma, Ozarks, and NE Colorado/SW Nebraska this evening/night. Hail larger than a baseball (2.75 inches) or wind reports above 75 mph are also signals to take shelter immediately.
- An evacuation order is issued near you in Utah, Nevada, Arizona, Oregon, or Washington -- 32 large fires are burning. Cottonwood Fire (Beaver UT) grew 30,000 acres overnight and five others have active evacuations. Conditions are critical in western Utah today with dry thunderstorms possible, and a major trough Friday-Saturday will bring widespread dangerous fire conditions. Know your evacuation route now.
- France or another EU country reports a second Ebola case -- this would indicate local transmission is occurring outside Africa, which would change the risk picture for international travel significantly. Spring season is approaching. UK PM Starmer resigned Monday and Britain is in a leadership transition, which can create additional uncertainty.
- Your employer's IT team declares an emergency involving network equipment or security monitoring systems this weekend -- there is an active federal deadline Sunday June 29 for Cisco network security patching. Active attack campaign targeting network management software with a federal deadline in 5 days (June 29).
- Venezuela earthquake death toll exceeds 1,000 OR a major aftershock (M6+) strikes Caracas area -- would indicate far greater structural damage than current reporting shows. Single week -- the outbreak has now crossed 1,000 total cases (2nd largest ever) with contact tracing at only 45%, well below the 90% needed to contain it.
