► **GEO-CF-IRAN:** US-IRAN MOU AGREED SUNDAY 14-JUN -- FORMAL SIGNING FRIDAY 19-JUN IN SWITZERLAND. HORMUZ OPENS UPON SIGNING. WAR NOT YET OVER. Pakistan PM Sharif confirmed deal text agreed; Iran Supreme National Security Council confirmed implementation begins only after signing. MOU: 60-day ceasefire extension covering Lebanon; Hormuz reopens post-signature (mine-clearing required, weeks-to-months to normalize); Iran permitted low-level enrichment; nuclear HEU disposition deferred to Phase 2. Israel is NOT party to deal. Beirut Dahiyyeh struck 14-JUN (3 killed, 7 wounded) by IDF -- nearly derailed MOU. Iran military signaled it "will not allow this to go unanswered." Brent fell >4% to ~\$83-84 on deal news (lowest since March). See GEO-CF-IRAN.

► **NUC-001:** IAEA BLACKOUT DAY 108 -- MOU DEFERS 440.9 KG HEU TO PHASE 2. 440.9 KG HEU WHEREABOUTS UNCONFIRMED. Iranian FM Araghchi: "the agreement does not create access." Fordow assessed largely intact. IAEA Board passed resolution 21-3 (10-JUN) demanding cooperation. Phase 2 nuclear talks deferred 60 days. See NUC-001.

federal BOD 26-04 3-day mandate applies. Ivanti Sentry RCE deadline passed 14-JUN -- unpatched installations are overdue. FBI confirmed spoofing attacks on official FIFA website/platforms during tournament Week 1. Check Point CVE-2026-50751 remains in overdue queue (+2 days). See CYB-001.

SIZE: US-Iran war (Op Epic Fury): commenced 28-FEB-2026. Hormuz effectively closed Day 108. MOU agreed Sunday 14-JUN; formal signing Friday 19-JUN, Bern/Switzerland. MOU covers: 60-day ceasefire extension including Lebanon; Hormuz reopening upon signing (mine-clearing); low-level enrichment permitted; HEU disposition deferred to Phase 2.

ACTIVITY: THIS CYCLE (13-15 JUN): The US and Iran reached a Memorandum of Understanding on Sunday 14-JUN to end the war. Pakistan PM Sharif announced deal text agreed and signing 19-JUN in Switzerland. Iran Supreme National Security Council confirmed: "war and military operations on all fronts, including Lebanon, will end immediately and permanently beginning tonight." Iran FM Araghchi confirmed but said implementation begins only after signing. Trump posted on Truth Social that Hormuz opens "upon signing, for purposes of mine removal." COMPLICATION: IDF struck Beirut Dahiyeh district Sunday 14-JUN (3 killed, 7 wounded) -- Hezbollah had launched projectiles toward northern Israel -- nearly derailed MOU negotiations. Iran military signaled it "will not allow Sunday's strikes to go unanswered." DEAL STATUS: Pakistan says electronic pre-signing underway. Iran has not committed to ceasing all operations before formal signature. Netanyahu: Israel "is not a party to" the deal but agrees Iran must not have nuclear weapons.

LOCATION: Diplomacy: Switzerland (signing 19-JUN); G7 Evian France (today, deal on agenda). Lebanon: IDF strikes Dahiyeh district 14-JUN. Hormuz: IRGC formally declared closed 11-JUN; ~95% below pre-war tanker traffic. Iran: Fordow/Isfahan nuclear sites (blackout Day 108).

TIME: MOU agreed evening Sunday 14-JUN. Signing ceremony Friday 19-JUN (location: Switzerland). Lebanon strikes: 14-JUN afternoon/evening. Hormuz physical reopening: weeks-to-months post-signing (mine-clearing required). Phase 2 nuclear talks: within 60-day window post-signing.

EQUIPMENT: Hormuz: mines, IRGC naval assets. Lebanon: IDF airstrikes. Nuclear: 440.9 kg 60%-HEU (last verified 28-FEB-2026, IAEA blackout Day 108).

UNIT: US CENTCOM; IRGC; IDF; Pakistan (mediator); Qatar (mediator); Lebanese Armed Forces; Hezbollah; IAEA (verification gap persists).

Why This Cycle

The US-Iran MOU is the most significant diplomatic development of the 107-day conflict. The deal text was agreed Sunday 14-JUN with Pakistan PM Sharif confirming and Iran's Supreme National Security Council confirming. Brent crude fell more than 4% to the low \$80s -- the lowest since March -- on the news. However the deal is not signed, the ceasefire does not take full legal effect until signature on 19-JUN, the 440.9 kg HEU stockpile disposition is deferred entirely to Phase 2 talks, and IDF strikes on Beirut's southern suburbs on Sunday (responding to Hezbollah projectiles) nearly derailed the negotiations. Iran military has signaled intent to respond to the Beirut strikes. The Lebanon thread is the primary near-term spoiler risk.

Summary

The United States and Iran agreed on the text of a Memorandum of Understanding on Sunday 14-JUN to end the 107-day war. Pakistan PM Sharif announced the deal text was finalized and that the official signing ceremony will be held on Friday 19-JUN in Switzerland, adding "electronic signing" was being prepared. Iran's Supreme National Security Council confirmed the agreement and stated "war and military operations on all fronts, including Lebanon, will end immediately and permanently beginning tonight." Iranian Deputy FM Gharibabadi confirmed but said implementation does not begin until after signing. Trump posted on Truth Social: "The Deal with the Islamic Republic of Iran is now complete. Congratulations to all!" and stated the Strait of Hormuz would open "upon signing, for purposes of mine removal." Key MOU terms: 60-day ceasefire extension (covering Lebanon); Hormuz reopens post-signature; Iran permitted low-level enrichment (Trump confirmed in NYT interview); HEU stockpile and final nuclear disposition deferred to Phase 2 talks; US to discuss sanctions relief and frozen asset release tied to compliance. Markets responded sharply: Brent fell more than 4% to ~\$83-84 on 15-JUN (lowest since March), WTI -5% to ~\$80. Physical Hormuz reopening will lag signature by weeks-to-months (mine-clearing, infrastructure repair, IRGC demobilization required). DHL projects 4-6 months to full normalization. MAJOR COMPLICATION: IDF struck Beirut's Dahiyeh

	district on Sunday 14-JUN (3 killed, 7 wounded), responding to Hezbollah projectiles fired at northern Israel. The strikes nearly derailed MOU negotiations. Iran's military signaled it "will not allow Sunday's strikes to go unanswered." Israel stated it is "not a party to" the deal. Netanyahu confirmed to Trump he agrees Iran must not have nuclear weapons but did not endorse deal terms.
Analyst Assessment	MOU SIGNIFICANCE: The MOU text being agreed represents the most significant de-escalation since the war began 28-FEB. The deal architecture -- 60-day ceasefire, Hormuz reopening, low-level enrichment permitted, HEU deferred to Phase 2 -- is structurally a time-buying framework, not a final resolution. The core proliferation question (440.9 kg 60%-enriched HEU, IAEA verification gap Day 108) is explicitly deferred. This means the fundamental driver of the war (Iranian nuclear program) remains unresolved for at least 60 more days. HORMUZ REOPENING TIMELINE: Trump's statement that Hormuz opens "upon signing, for purposes of mine removal" is the operative language. Mine-clearing in the Strait of Hormuz is not a hours-long operation -- it requires days to weeks of coordinated naval effort (EOD teams, survey vessels, route confirmation) before commercial tankers can transit safely. DHL's 4-6 month normalization forecast reflects the full chain: signing, mine-clearing, IRGC demobilization, infrastructure repair, shipping confidence recovery, and production ramp-up. The market has priced in the deal but physical barrels through Hormuz will lag by months. LEBANON SPOILER RISK: Sunday's IDF strikes on Beirut's Dahiyeh district (3 killed, Hezbollah projectile fire triggered) nearly derailed the MOU negotiations in real time. Iran's military stated it "will not allow this to go unanswered." The MOU includes Lebanon in its ceasefire language, but Israel is explicitly not a party to the deal. Netanyahu retained a free hand on Hezbollah operations and has stated that clearly. The next IDF-Hezbollah exchange is the single most likely near-term MOU spoiler. IAEA ACCESS GAP PERSISTS: Iranian FM Araghchi explicitly stated the MOU "does not create access" for IAEA inspectors. Until Phase 2 talks produce a verification mechanism, the IAEA verification blackout (Day 108) continues. Saudi Arabia has conditioned Phase 2 nuclear acceptance on IAEA verification guarantees the agency can no longer provide. This is the structural constraint on the deal's durability. CHANGE FROM PRIOR: Major escalation. MOU text agreed 14-JUN -- deal framework exists for the first time. Score adjusted downward from 26 to 24 reflecting diplomatic breakthrough, with significant residual risk warranting FLASH retention. Prior cycle: third-night strike called off, settlement "announced" but unverified; no confirmed text. Current cycle: text confirmed by both parties, signing ceremony confirmed 19-JUN. Brent fell >4% to ~\$83-84. Lebanon IDF strikes and Iran military response signal are the key offsetting risk factors holding the score above 20. LIKELIHOOD: MOU signing proceeds as scheduled 19-JUN in Switzerland: LIKELY. CONFIDENCE: MODERATE. LIKELIHOOD: Lebanon IDF-Hezbollah exchange collapses MOU before signing: UNLIKELY but non-trivial. CONFIDENCE: MODERATE. LIKELIHOOD: Hormuz commercially viable for tanker traffic within 30 days of signing: VERY UNLIKELY. CONFIDENCE: HIGH.

Why This Cycle	The US-Iran MOU agreed Sunday 14-JUN explicitly defers HEU disposition to Phase 2 talks and does NOT create IAEA access -- confirmed by Iranian FM Araghchi on the day of agreement. This is the most significant NUC-001 development this cycle: the diplomatic resolution everyone was waiting for arrived, and it leaves the proliferation verification gap entirely intact for at least another 60 days. Saudi Arabia has conditioned Phase 2 nuclear	

	acceptance on IAEA verification guarantees the agency can no longer provide. The structural constraint on the deal's durability is the gap between what the MOU promises (nuclear negotiations) and what exists (no verification mechanism).
Summary	The IAEA verification blackout entered Day 108 with the US-Iran MOU agreed but not yet signed. Iranian FM Araghchi explicitly stated on 14-JUN that the MOU "does not create access" for IAEA inspectors. The 440.9 kg of 60%-enriched HEU last verified by the IAEA on 27-FEB-2026 remains unaccounted -- the MOU defers HEU disposition entirely to Phase 2 talks within a 60-day post-signing window. Trump confirmed in a New York Times interview that the MOU permits Iran low-level enrichment; final enrichment limits and HEU disposal are Phase 2 subjects. The IAEA Board passed a resolution 21-3 on 10-JUN demanding cooperation; Russia, China, and Niger voted against. Fordow underground facility and Isfahan tunnel complex are both assessed as largely intact. Western officials assessed (Bloomberg, 3-JUN) that the risk of covert nuclear weapons pursuit is higher today than before the February 2026 US-Israeli strikes.
Analyst Assessment	PROLIFERATION SIGNIFICANCE: 440.9 kg of 60%-enriched uranium is sufficient fissile material for multiple nuclear weapons if further enriched to 90%+. At 60% the material is already well past the threshold enrichment level and represents the most proliferation-significant HEU stockpile outside declared nuclear weapon states. The verification gap means neither the quantity nor the location of this material can be confirmed by any external party. DEAL LEVERAGE DYNAMIC: The HEU stockpile is Iran's primary negotiating leverage. Surrendering it as the US demands removes that leverage permanently. Iran's down-blend counter-offer preserves the option of re-enrichment and is therefore strategically rational from Tehran's perspective. This asymmetry is unlikely to resolve without a verification mechanism neither side has demonstrated willingness to create. SETTLEMENT LINKAGE: The announced US-Iran settlement (see GEO-CF-IRAN) is the only near-term pathway to restored IAEA verification. Netanyahu has signaled the enriched-uranium and future-enrichment questions remain unresolved, and ACLED (9-JUN) assessed the proposed framework defers the nuclear core to follow-on talks. Until a signed agreement restores access, the 440.9 kg of 60-percent HEU remains unaccounted and unverifiable. LIKELIHOOD: Iran maintaining functional enrichment capacity with no IAEA visibility: ALMOST CERTAIN. CONFIDENCE: HIGH. LIKELIHOOD: HEU stockpile surrendered or fully verifiably down-blended within 30 days: ALMOST NO CHANCE. CONFIDENCE: HIGH. Why This Cycle	The Check Point CVE-2026-50751 FCEB remediation deadline PASSED on 11-JUN. Any FCEB agency that has not patched or disconnected affected VPN appliances is now in violation of binding federal cyber policy, and the posture shifts from patch-by-deadline to active threat-hunt for compromise. Microsoft Patch Tuesday (10-JUN) released 200+ CVEs in a single day -- record release -- including 3 zero-days with technical details publicly known before patches were available. RoguePlanet PoC published within hours of Patch Tuesday by Nightmare Eclipse, giving adversaries a working exploit the same day defenders received the patch. The combination of Check Point deadline day plus record Patch Tuesday plus active RoguePlanet PoC creates a high-density defender pressure window. Iran-linked cyber actors maintain confirmed ICS/OT campaign against US critical infrastructure (see CYB-001 prior body). Secure Boot certificate expiration deadline 26-JUN is 15 days away.
Summary	CISA added three new vulnerabilities to the Known Exploited Vulnerabilities catalog on 09-JUN: a Google Chromium V8 out-of-bounds flaw affecting all Chromium-based browsers (due 23-JUN), an Arista EOS network OS incomplete comparison flaw (due 23-JUN), and a Cisco Catalyst SD-WAN Manager output encoding vulnerability (due 23-JUN). The three-sector sweep in one day is consistent with strategic pre-positioning. The Check Point Security Gateway authentication bypass (CVE-2026-50751, added 08-JUN) reaches its FCEB mandatory remediation deadline PASSED 11-JUN; active exploitation has been confirmed since May 7 with a Qilin ransomware affiliate linked to at least one confirmed post-compromise case (Rapid7 high confidence). FCEB agencies that have not patched or disconnected are in violation of binding federal cyber policy as of 11-JUN; this is now an active incident-response posture, not a patch-cycle item. MICROSOFT PATCH TUESDAY 10-JUN (RECORD): 200+ CVEs patched -- the largest single Patch Tuesday release in the program history. Three publicly disclosed zero-days: CVE-2026-50507 (BitLocker bypass), CVE-2026-49160 (HTTP.sys DoS, remotely exploitable), CVE-2026-45586 (CTFMON EoP). Within hours of Patch Tuesday release, researcher Nightmare Eclipse dropped a new PoC for RoguePlanet (race condition in Windows Defender, spawns SYSTEM-level shell). 54 RCE vulnerabilities total; 11 RDE CVEs in Remote Desktop Client. Critical: Windows Hyper-V RCE (CVE-2026-47652), Windows Kerberos KDC RCE (CVE-2026-47288). Also: Secure Boot certificate expiration deadline 26-JUN (15 days from today). CISA new Binding Operational Directive consequence-based prioritization shift is live today.
Analyst Assessment	THREE-SECTOR PATTERN: Browser (Chromium V8) plus network OS (Arista EOS) plus SD-WAN management plane (Cisco Catalyst) in a single KEV publishing event covers end-user access, network transit, and remote management simultaneously. This is not the profile of opportunistic criminal exploitation, which typically targets a single high-value vulnerability. The combination is consistent with nation-state pre-positioning to establish persistent access across multiple layers of enterprise architecture before executing a coordinated campaign. CHECK POINT URGENCY: CVE-2026-50751 Check Point Security Gateway is perimeter VPN infrastructure for thousands of enterprise and government networks. Active exploitation is confirmed. FCEB deadline is TODAY 11-JUN. Any organization -- not just federal agencies -- that has not patched or disconnected the affected appliances should treat this as an active incident response situation, not a patch management cycle item. GEOPOLITICAL CONTEXT: The active US-Iran military exchange materially elevates the probability that IRGC-nexus or MOIS-affiliated cyber actors are behind some or all of the 09-JUN KEV exploitation activity. Iran has a documented pattern of escalating cyber operations against US critical infrastructure during periods of kinetic confrontation, including the confirmed ICS/OT campaign noted in prior cycles (CISA-FBI-NSA joint advisory April 2026). No attribution has been confirmed by CISA for the 09-JUN entries. The war remains a standing thread the suite tracks, so the entry is retained at MONITOR / CONTINUED with the score reduced from 15 to 10 rather than carried at HIGH on stale 07-JUN data (Chornobyl strike, E3 summit, Zelenskyy-Putin rejection), all of which were prior-cycle items. If a US-relevant delta emerges (a confirmed US policy or aid change, a NATO-territory incident, or a strike on a US-linked asset) this returns to a scored HIGH entry.

Summary

Russia conducted an overnight drone barrage against Kyiv and Mykolaiv (ISW), consistent with the ongoing pattern of sustained long-range strikes. The diplomatic track remains stalled, with US mediation attention shifted to the Middle East. No US-household-relevant change occurred this cycle; the prior-cycle items (the 07-JUN Chornobyl spent-fuel-storage drone strike, the worsening occupied-Crimea supply shortages, the rejected Zelenskyy-Putin meeting, and the London E3 summit) are not repeated here because they carry no current-cycle delta. This entry is retained only as a standing background watch.

Analyst Assessment

BACKGROUND-WATCH STATUS: No US-household-relevant delta this cycle. The overnight Kyiv/Mykolaiv barrage is pattern-consistent and does not change the assessment. Demoted to MONITOR / CONTINUED, score 15 to 10, pending a genuine US-relevant development.

No direct connection between the ICA (Irish Citizen Army, new far-right group) and the current riots has been confirmed; the ICA is a background-level organisational presence within the broader Irish far-right ecosystem currently under Garda monitoring.
Analyst Assessment	CHANGE FROM PRIOR: De-escalation. PSNI reports 16 arrested this week and 12 officers injured Wednesday; water cannon and attenuating energy projectiles (AEPs) used. Social media platforms have not acted to limit amplification. Expect continued spread of calls for protests in UK cities throughout today. ICA CONTEXT: The Irish Citizen Army (ICA) -- a new far-right group that has appropriated the name of the 1913 socialist labour militia -- is a background-level presence within the broader ecosystem but is NOT the operational driver of current events. The ICA is under Garda monitoring including involvement of the anti-terror Special Detective Unit. Its splinter group the Irish Defence Army (IDA) had five members arrested in December 2025 for plotting to attack a mosque in Galway and target migrant accommodation. The ICA's online activity uses AI-generated Marvel superhero imagery and is assessed as primarily online and disorganised at this stage. However, the current riot environment provides exactly the conditions under which such groups historically attempt to insert themselves as organisational nodes. US EQUITIES: US citizens in Belfast, Glasgow, and London should exercise caution and avoid protest areas. The US Embassy demonstration alert is an operational signal: US government personnel are being warned. US-Ireland and US-UK relations are not materially affected. The Sudanese national's asylum route (Paris to Dublin to Northern Ireland) will draw attention to the Common Travel Area and may generate political pressure on the Irish government from the UK. 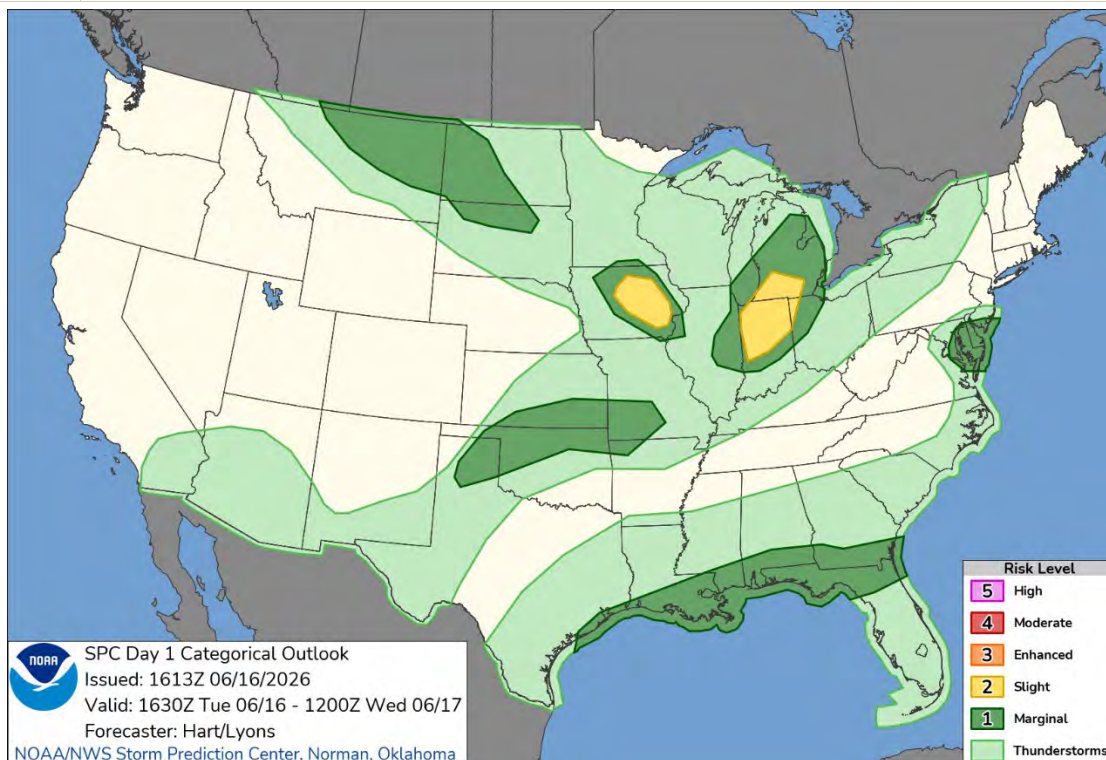
WEDNESDAY SEVERE OUTBREAK: The Day 2 MODERATE Risk for central IL/NW IN is the most significant weather threat this cycle. The combination of 60-80 kt 500mb jet, 50-60 kt 850mb LLJ, near-70F dewpoints, and MLCAPE 2500-3500 J/kg is a high-end early-summer environment. Key uncertainty is warm front position: if it parks further north it could support faster-moving long-track supercells along the boundary. Illinois/Indiana residents in the Moderate Risk zone should have severe weather plans in place by Tuesday evening.

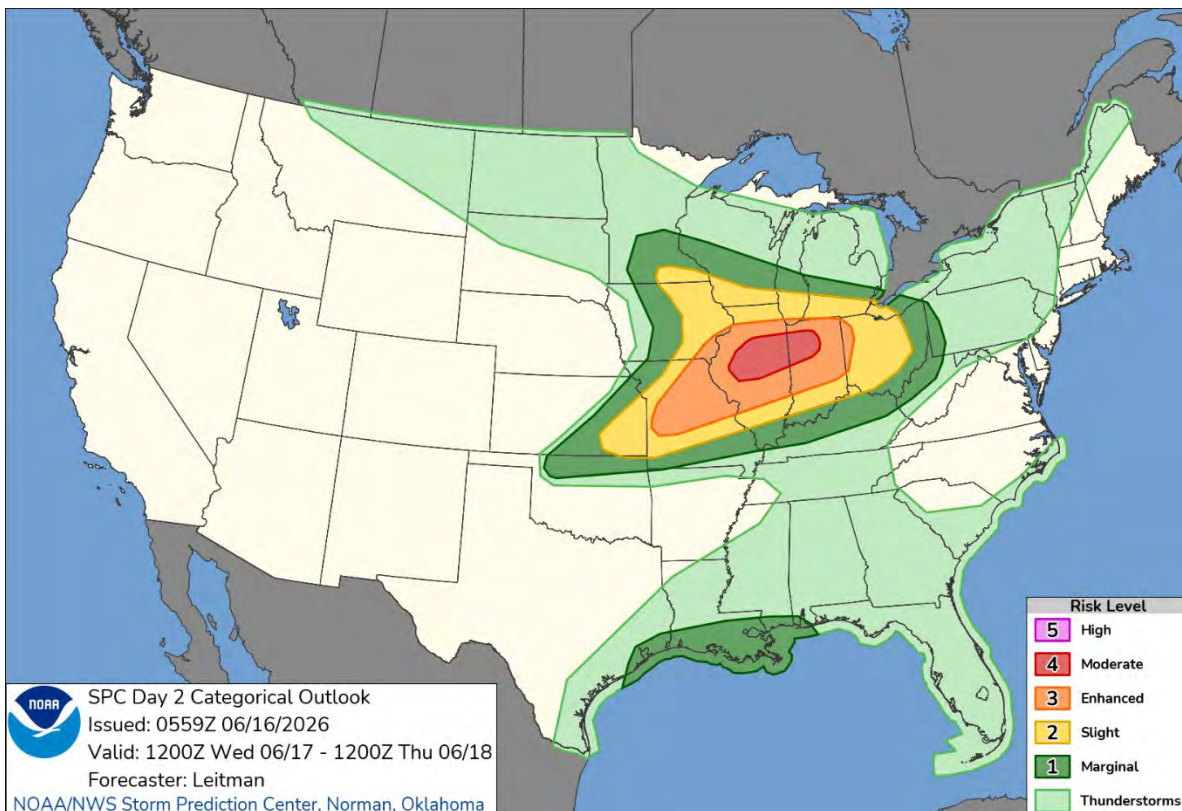
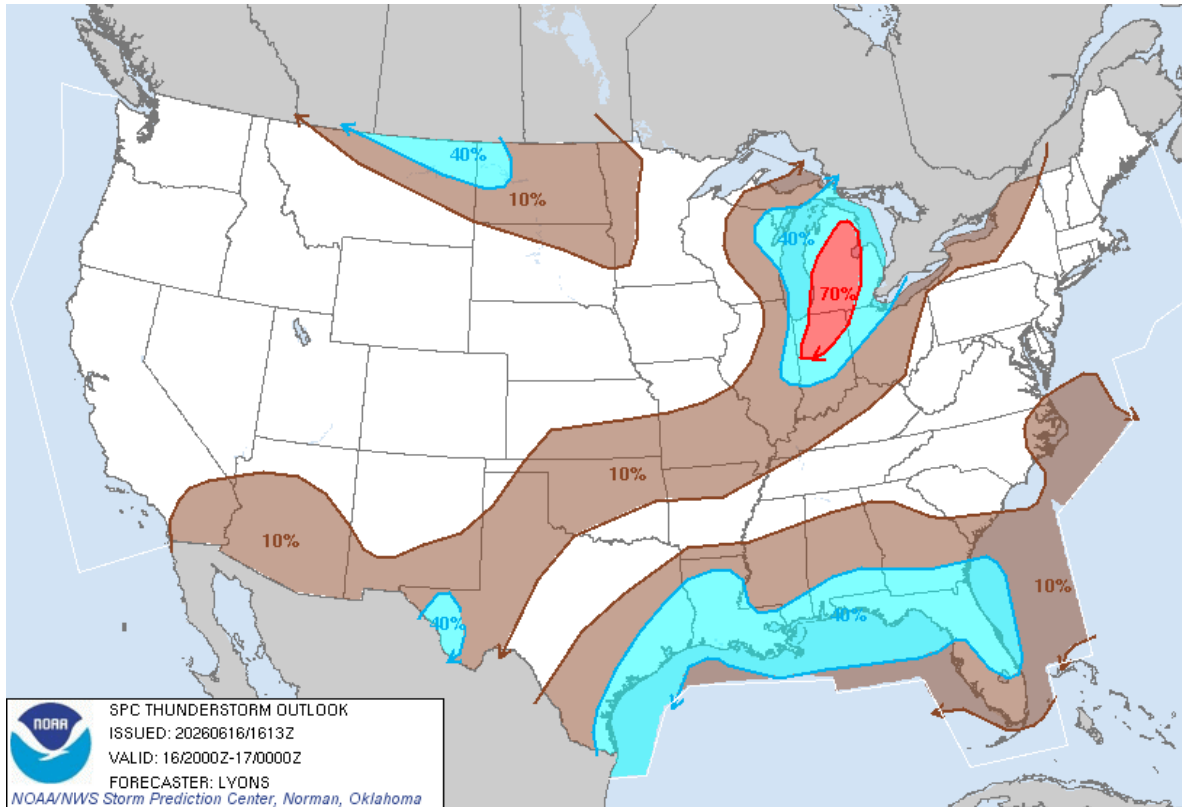

NEW MEXICO: Seven Cabins Fire (Lincoln NF, 13 mi NE of Capitan): minimal fire behavior, smoldering; numerous structures threatened; area/road/trail closures; complex IMT. Bear Fire (Gila NF, 18 mi SE of Quemado): ~150 acres, running/flanking/spotting, structures threatened. NM triple-gap NWR (Artesia WXN24 / Roswell WWG36 / Carlsbad WWF37 all OOS) leaves Chaves and Eddy counties without primary NWR alerting during active fire season.

SOUTHWEST AREA (SWCC most active GACC): 3 fires, 38,632 cumulative acres, 671 personnel. Today's Day 1 fire weather conditions (elevated-to-critical WY/NE Panhandle; elevated Great Basin/Four Corners) apply directly to this GACC's active fire country.

ALASKA: Multiple fires in the Galena Zone (BLM) area including Kopshesut; structures threatened. SE Alaska: 12 Juneau-cluster NWR transmitters DEGRADED further compounds wildfire alerting in AK.

Analyst Assessment

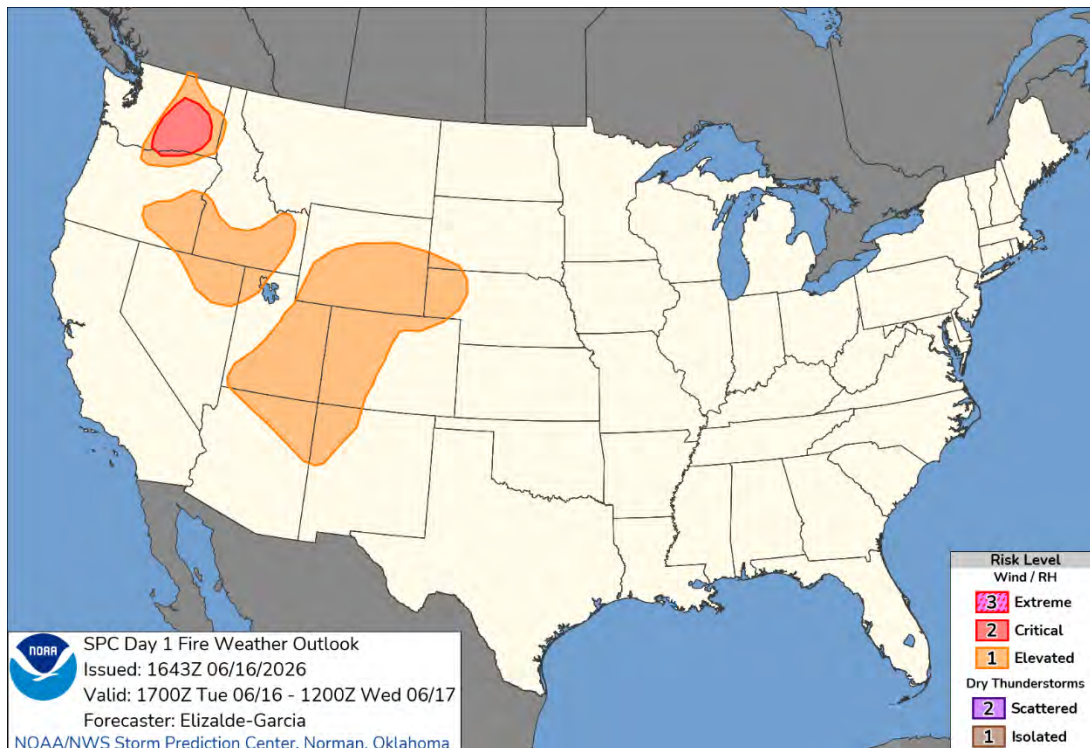
SEASON TRAJECTORY: At 195% of the 10-year average for acres burned with NPL at 2 of 5, the 2026 fire season is running significantly above historical norms. Sustained drought across the Southeast (99% in drought) and Southwest, combined with above-normal temperatures, supports continued elevated risk. The season peak in the Rocky Mountain and Pacific Northwest regions typically arrives July-August; current indicators suggest that peak may arrive earlier or with greater intensity.

IPAWS/NWR GAPS IN FIRE COUNTRY: The NM triple-gap NWR outage (all three transmitters covering Chaves/Eddy/Lincoln counties OOS) is specifically notable given Seven Cabins Fire activity in Lincoln County and active fire restrictions. Residents and firefighting operations in this area must rely on WEA mobile alerts, FEMA App, and radio broadcast EAS exclusively.

CRITICAL COLUMBIA BASIN TODAY: The Day 1 CRITICAL area in eastern Washington and N-central Oregon is the most significant fire weather threat this cycle. The combination of 70-kt midlevel jet, Cascade downslope flow, 20-25 mph sustained westerlies with 30-40 mph gusts, and 15-25% RH on dry fuels creates conditions for rapid fire growth and spotting. Any new ignition in the Columbia Basin today should be treated as a potential large-fire situation from the outset. Monitor WA-DNR and NWCC resources.

LIKELIHOOD: New fire starts in the Columbia Basin / eastern Washington critical zone today: **LIKELY** given CRITICAL conditions. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

LIKELIHOOD: South Fork Fire NE achieving 70%+ containment by 18-JUN absent new weather event: **ROUGHLY EVEN CHANCE** given declining fire wx conditions. **CONFIDENCE:** LOW.

The MOU announcement is a significant de-escalation signal but does not justify a step down: the deal is unsigned, the ceasefire does not take legal effect until 19-JUN, IAEA access has been explicitly excluded from the MOU, Lebanon IDF-Hezbollah exchanges continue, and the World Cup mass-gathering period is in full operation with confirmed soft-target and cyber threat activity. The prior-cycle G2 storm watch (PREP-CON 4 trigger per \$0.129) has been cancelled, removing that specific trigger. Remaining triggers still met at Possible tier: (1) active KEV exploitation including KEV deadline TODAY (Oracle PeopleSoft), Ivanti deadline passed 14-JUN, Check Point overdue; (2) World Cup mass-gathering open; (3) MARAD 2026-008 active (Hormuz maritime risk remains HIGH pre-signing); (4) G7 summit opens today with confirmed Black Bloc protest activity in Geneva; (5) Iran vs NZ in LA tonight with protests and extra security. A step down to PREP-CON 5 would require: MOU signed, ceasefire in force, Hormuz reopening underway, and resolution of active KEV exploitation window. None of those conditions are met today.

MOVEMENT ASSESSMENT

SUPPORTS STEP DOWN TO 5 (after 19-JUN): If MOU signs Friday 19-JUN, Lebanon ceasefire holds, and Hormuz mine-clearing begins, the basis for PREP-CON 4 erodes meaningfully. Monitor 19-JUN signing status as the primary trigger for a re-assessment.

SUPPORTS STAYING AT 4 (today): Unsigned deal, Lebanon volatile, active KEV exploitation, World Cup Day 6, G7 protests, Iran vs NZ tonight. All Possible-tier triggers remain active. ORANGE SKY is the correct posture until signature confirms and Lebanon stabilizes.

Today's packed agenda includes: Ukraine session with Ukrainian President Zelenskyy attending at French President Macron's invitation (context: Russia conducted large-scale drone/missile strikes on Kyiv, Dnipro, and Kharkiv overnight 14-15 JUN per ISW, damaging cultural sites and injuring civilians); Middle East/Iran session with Egypt, Qatar, and UAE leaders joining G7 (France has been pressing for G7 communique language demanding Iran nuclear cooperation with IAEA as precondition for Phase 2 talks). G7 closes 17-JUN; Iran MOU signing follows 19-JUN in Switzerland -- two-day gap. Pre-summit violence (Geneva, Sunday 14-JUN): 20,000 marched in organized No-G7 coalition demonstration; Black Bloc splinter (~600) torched a Tesla, smashed bank and ATM windows, clashed with Swiss police. No major violence reported at the G7 itself (Evian is across the French border, heavily secured).

BLACK BLOC CONTINUATION: The Sunday Geneva pattern (peaceful 20,000 + violent 600 splinter) is likely to repeat Monday and Tuesday. The Black Bloc presence is organized and equipped; continued property damage and police confrontations are likely. Direct threat to G7 venue or leaders is assessed as very unlikely given exceptional security measures.

CONVERGENCE SIGNIFICANCE: The G7 (Evian) and Iran MOU signing (Switzerland, Friday) create the most concentrated diplomatic event sequence in the current threat environment. World Cup concurrent in the US. Security and intelligence bandwidth is stretched across multiple high-profile simultaneous events.

LIKELIHOOD: Further protest-related property damage or police confrontations Geneva during G7: LIKELY. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.
