MOU SIGNED: Trump signed US-Iran MOU at Versailles 17-JUN; Pezeshkian signed separately in Tehran. MOU in force -- oil sanctions waivers active -- Hormuz reopening. Phase 2 Burgenstock 19-JUN uncertain (Iran FM paused). See GEO-CF-IRAN.

ARTHUR REMNANTS: Post-tropical Arthur remnants moving NE through Gulf Coast -- WPC HIGH RISK ERO + PDS Flash Flood Watch southern MS/AL through 19-JUN 0600Z - - life-threatening flash flooding Mobile/Pensacola corridor -- 5-10 in forecast, isolated 20 in. See WX-001.

IL/IN TORNADES: Second outbreak: central IL tornadoes 17-JUN -- Coles, Effingham, Newton counties confirmed -- 2 injured near Montrose (non-life-threatening) -- thousands without power -- NWS surveys ongoing. Prior 11-JUN outbreak: 20 confirmed, max EF-3 (Streator IL / Kouts IN), no fatalities. See WX-001.

SPC ENHANCED: SPC Day 2 ENHANCED developing lower MI/N IL/N IN today -- see WX-001 + NWR compound gaps.

OIL/FUEL: Brent ~\$88-90 falling on de-escalation; pump avg ~\$4.13-4.17 (3rd weekly decline); Jones Act waived 60 days -- see FIN-001.

NWR: NWR: 29 transmitters affected (13 OOS / 16 DEGRADED) per operator-supplied 18-JUN roster. Heavy AK Juneau cluster (12 DEGRADED). THE CYCLE - QUICK LOOK

► **GEO-CF-IRAN:** MOU SIGNED 17-JUN -- TRUMP AT VERSAILLES / PEZESHKIAN IN TEHRAN -- DEAL IN FORCE TWO DAYS AHEAD OF BURGENSTOCK CEREMONY. BURGENSTOCK PHASE 2 POSTPONED 19-JUN. ISRAEL STRIKES LEBANON. BRENT \$77-79. MOU signed 17-JUN at Versailles (Trump) and Tehran (Pezeshkian). In force Day 3. Burgenstock Phase 2 implementation talks POSTPONED 19-JUN -- Swiss foreign ministry confirmed talks deferred after Israel conducted new strikes on Hezbollah targets in Lebanon. Vance departure to Switzerland also deferred. No new date set. Hormuz: Zero new commercial outbound transits as of 0622Z 19-JUN -- stranded Iranian VLCCs exiting (3.8M bbl, prior cycle); sustained commercial flow not yet established. Mine clearance and 8x war-risk insurance premiums continue to suppress transits. Brent \$77-79/bbl, down ~10% for week -- erasing nearly all war premium. Kuwait announcing output increases. Israel-Lebanon compliance: IDF confirmed troops remain in security zone and will "continue to remove threats"; Netanyahu rejected Vance request to scale back. Iran FM Araghchi called this MOU violation. See GEO-CF-IRAN.

► **NUC-001: IAEA BLACKOUT DAY 113 -- MOU DOES NOT CREATE IAEA ACCESS -- BURGENSTOCK POSTPONED MEANS PHASE 2 NUCLEAR TALKS HAVE NOT COMMENCED. 440.9 KG 60% HEU UNVERIFIED.** MOU text confirms IAEA supervision of uranium downblending "on site" -- but mechanics remain Phase 2 subject. Iran FM Araghchi explicitly stated agreement does not create inspector access. Arms Control Association: even starting from zero, Iranian breakout time likely less than 12 months. IAEA Board passed resolution 21-3 on 10-JUN demanding cooperation. Russia, China, Niger voted against. Phase 2 nuclear talks window: 60 days post-signing. Fordow largely intact; Isfahan tunnel complex unverified. See NUC-001.

► **CYB-001: CHECK POINT CVE-2026-50751 VPN AUTH BYPASS -- FCEB DEADLINE PASSED 11-JUN (+7 DAYS) -- WATCHTOWR POC PUBLIC 12-JUN -- BROADER OPPORTUNISTIC WAVE EXPECTED.** CVE-2026-50751 (CVSS 9.3): authentication bypass in Check Point Remote Access VPN / Mobile Access / Spark Firewalls via deprecated IKEv1. Qilin ransomware affiliate confirmed in at least one post-compromise chain. Exploitation observed since 7-MAY; PoC published 12-JUN -- escalation risk elevated. Hotfix available for R81.20, R82, R82.10; end-of-support versions receive no hotfix. FCEB agencies were required to patch by 11-JUN -- now 7 days overdue. CISA KEV: CVE-2026-48907 (Joomla JCE improper access control) added 16-JUN. See CYB-001.

Landry); 1 road crew worker killed MS; 200+ homes flooded Avoyelles Parish LA (31+ inches in 5 days Cottonport); Anchor Lake Dam NOT breached. National Guard conducting water rescues. PDS Flash Flood Watch expired 0600Z 19-JUN. Remnants tracking NE through FL into Carolinas today. SPC Day 1 MARGINAL: TX-FL + Carolinas (remnant moisture, gusty winds, hail); MN/WI (hail); Central Plains (overnight elevated). SPC Day 2 ENHANCED: Central Plains KS/NE/CO -- supercells, large to very large hail, 75+ mph winds, tornado risk. IL double-gap: Lockport + Hillsboro NWR both OOS. ► **WORLD CUP DAY 10 (19-JUN): USA vs Australia (Seattle 1900Z) is the high-visibility match today.** No major security incidents at 18-JUN matches. Iran flag ban TRO lawsuit pending in LA Superior Court -- Iran vs Belgium at SoFi 21-JUN is the next elevated protest/security posture event. 28 drones interdicted since tournament open per FBI. Handala claimed infiltration of FBI drone systems (unconfirmed disruption). CA-Los Angeles KWO37 NWR OOS is a new gap affecting SoFi/Inglewood corridor.

► **PHS-002: CENTRAL AFRICA EBOLA (BUNDIBUGYO) DAY 35 PHEIC: 837 CONFIRMED / 196 DEATHS DRC (as of 15-JUN ECDC); UGANDA 19 CONFIRMED. +29 CASES +4 DEATHS SINCE 16-JUN UPDATE. NO LICENSED VACCINE OR TREATMENT.** +29 new confirmed cases in last 24 hrs per ECDC 17-JUN. Ituri province: 767 cases (20 health zones). North Kivu: 67 cases (10 health zones). South Kivu: 3 cases (1 health zone). No new countries affected. Contact tracing ~70% (WHO requires 90%). CFR approximately 23%. No WHO Friday sitrep confirmed published this cycle. Bundibugyo strain: no approved vaccine or therapeutic. See PHS-002.

WEEKEND UNREST RISK ELEVATED (19-20 JUN).** Day 10: Fragile calm holding post-peak (violence peaked 9-11 JUN). Ogilvie family reported 17-JUN: victim out of induced coma, may still lose right eye. Alodid remanded, next court date not yet set. PSNI race hate incidents at record 2,367 in year to March 2026. Active Club Ulster Youth Club neo-Nazi network involvement confirmed. Tommy Robinson posted 26 UK demonstration locations. 19-20 JUN weekend represents elevated recurrence risk given structural conditions. Tens of thousands attended UAR rally 13-JUN. PSNI elevated posture maintained. See DOM-002.

► **EU COUNCIL 18-19 JUN CONCLUSIONS:** EU27 leaders adopted Ukraine conclusions 18-19 JUN. Key outcomes: accession cluster formally opened 15-JUN (Ukraine/Moldova fundamentals cluster); EUR 90B loan first disbursement to Ukraine before end of June; EU "ready to step up engagement in peace negotiations"

(first time EU endorses hands-on peace process role); condemned Russian drone that crashed into Romanian residential building 29-MAY; Ukraine Recovery Conference Gdansk 25-26 JUN. No Russian ceasefire signal. Leaders heard from Zelenskyy.

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Why This Cycle	The US-Iran MOU is the most significant diplomatic development of the 107-day conflict. The deal text was agreed Sunday 14-JUN with Pakistan PM Sharif confirming and Iran's Supreme National Security Council confirming. Brent crude fell more than 4% to the low \$80s -- the lowest since March -- on the news. However the deal is not signed, the ceasefire does not take full legal effect until signature on 19-JUN, the 440.9 kg HEU stockpile disposition is deferred entirely to Phase 2 talks, and IDF strikes on Beirut's southern suburbs on Sunday (responding to Hezbollah projectiles) nearly derailed the negotiations. Iran military has signaled intent to respond to the Beirut strikes. The Lebanon thread is the primary near-term spoiler risk.
Summary	The United States and Iran agreed on the text of a Memorandum of Understanding on Sunday 14-JUN to end the 107-day war. Pakistan PM Sharif announced the deal text was finalized and that the official signing ceremony will be held on Friday 19-JUN in Switzerland, adding "electronic signing" was being prepared. Iran's Supreme National Security Council confirmed the agreement and stated "war and military operations on all fronts, including Lebanon, will end immediately and permanently beginning tonight." Iranian Deputy FM Gharibabadi confirmed but said implementation does not begin until after signing. Trump posted on Truth Social: "The Deal with the Islamic Republic of Iran is now complete. Congratulations to all!" and stated the Strait of Hormuz would open "upon signing, for purposes of mine removal." Key MOU terms: 60-day ceasefire extension (covering Lebanon); Hormuz reopens post-signature; Iran permitted low-level enrichment (Trump confirmed in NYT interview); HEU stockpile and final nuclear disposition deferred to Phase 2 talks; US to discuss sanctions relief and frozen asset release tied to compliance. Markets responded sharply: Brent fell more than 4% to ~\$83-84 on 15-JUN (lowest since March), WTI -5% to ~\$80. Physical Hormuz reopening will lag signature by weeks-to-months (mine-clearing, infrastructure repair, IRGC demobilization required). DHL projects 4-6 months to full normalization. MAJOR COMPLICATION: IDF struck Beirut's Dahiyeh district on Sunday 14-JUN (3 killed, 7 wounded), responding to Hezbollah projectiles fired at northern Israel. The strikes nearly derailed MOU negotiations. Iran's military signaled it "will not allow Sunday's strikes to go unanswered." Israel stated it is "not a party to" the deal. Netanyahu confirmed to Trump he agrees Iran must not have nuclear weapons but did not endorse deal terms.
Analyst Assessment	MOU SIGNIFICANCE: Both presidents signing represents the most significant de-escalation since the war began 28-FEB. The deal is structurally a time-buying framework: oil sanctions relief and Hormuz reopening are immediate; the hard questions (HEU disposition, IAEA verification, Iranian missile program, Hezbollah) are explicitly deferred to Phase 2. Per Times of Israel: Iran's theocratic government remains in place, its HEU stockpile has not been surrendered, its missile capabilities have not been destroyed, and it has not ended support for Hezbollah. The US appears to have achieved little of its declared war goals while Iran has achieved major sanctions relief. The 60-day Phase 2 window begins a clock, not a resolution. HORMUZ REOPENING TIMELINE: Trump's statement that Hormuz opens "upon signing, for purposes of mine removal" is the operative language. Mine-clearing in the Strait of Hormuz is not a hours-long operation -- it requires days to weeks of coordinated naval effort (EOD teams, survey vessels, route confirmation) before commercial tankers can transit safely. DHL's 4-6 month normalization forecast reflects the full chain: signing, mine-clearing, IRGC demobilization, infrastructure repair, shipping confidence recovery, and production ramp-up. The market has priced in the deal but physical barrels through Hormuz will lag by months. LEBANON SPOILER RISK: Sunday's IDF strikes on Beirut's Dahiyeh district (3 killed, Hezbollah projectile fire triggered) nearly derailed the MOU negotiations in real time. Iran's military stated it "will not allow this to go unanswered." The MOU includes Lebanon in its ceasefire language, but Israel is explicitly not a party to the deal. Netanyahu retained a free hand on Hezbollah operations and has stated that clearly. The next IDF-Hezbollah exchange is the single most likely near-term MOU spoiler. PHASE 2 BURGENSTOCK WATCH: Burgenstock Phase 2 talks were scheduled for 19-JUN but Iran FM Baghaei stated the meeting is paused. Swiss FDFA says plan still stands. The gap between these positions is the single most important 24-hour indicator. If the meeting proceeds, the 60-day negotiating clock starts with structure. If it does not, the MOU's implementation

timeline is undefined. The Israeli non-compliance on Lebanon is a live spoiler -- any IDF strike in Lebanon could allow Iran to invoke MOU violation and exit the agreement.

CHANGE FROM PRIOR: Major escalation. MOU text agreed 14-JUN -- deal framework exists for the first time. Score adjusted downward from 26 to 24 reflecting diplomatic breakthrough, with significant residual risk warranting FLASH retention. Prior cycle: third-night strike called off, settlement "announced" but unverified; no confirmed text. Current cycle: text confirmed by both parties, signing ceremony confirmed 19-JUN. Brent fell >4% to ~\$83-84. Lebanon IDF strikes and Iran military response signal are the key offsetting risk factors holding the score above 20.

LIKELIHOOD: MOU signing proceeds as scheduled 19-JUN in Switzerland: LIKELY.
CONFIDENCE: MODERATE.

LIKELIHOOD: Lebanon IDF-Hezbollah exchange collapses MOU before signing: UNLIKELY but non-trivial. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

LIKELIHOOD: Hormuz commercially viable for tanker traffic within 30 days of signing: VERY UNLIKELY. **CONFIDENCE:** HIGH.

ALT A: MOU signing proceeds 19-JUN; ceasefire holds; Hormuz reopens (mine-clearing phase begins) [likely]

Deal text confirmed by both sides; Pakistan and Qatar mediating; Trump and Iran SNSC both publicly confirmed; oil markets priced in deal; Trump at G7 Evian today where Iran deal will be on agenda; economic incentives on both sides are enormous.

✓ **Supporting Evidence:** Iran FM Araghchi confirmed agreement; SNSC confirmed; economic and political pressure on Tehran to end conflict; Brent fell >4% reflecting high market confidence in near-term signing.

✗ **Ruling-Out Evidence:** Lebanon IDF-Hezbollah exchange on 14-JUN nearly derailed the deal; Iran military "will not allow Sunday's strikes to go unanswered"; Israel is not party to deal and retains operational freedom; Supreme Leader Khamenei final sign-off not publicly confirmed; physical Hormuz reopening will take weeks-to-months regardless.

ALT B: Lebanon exchange escalates and collapses MOU before 19-JUN signing [unlikely]

IDF strikes on Dahiyeh 14-JUN and Iran's stated intent to respond create a live tripwire; Hezbollah has repeatedly violated ceasefire terms; Israel has explicitly said it is not bound by the US-Iran deal; prior exchanges (7-JUN, 14-JUN) each nearly derailed negotiations.

✓ **Supporting Evidence:** Both the US and Iran have strong economic incentives to preserve the deal; Trump explicitly condemned Sunday's Israeli strikes on Beirut (a departure from prior posture); Pakistan and Qatar mediators remain actively engaged; Iran SNSC confirmed ceasefire intent same day as Dahiyeh strikes.

✗ **Ruling-Out Evidence:** If it were going to collapse it likely would have collapsed on Sunday night given Iranian military statements; the pace of events has been absorb-and-sign rather than escalate-and-reject.

LOCATION: Natanz (above-ground centrifuge hall significantly degraded by strikes); Fordow underground enrichment facility (assessed intact); Isfahan tunnel complex (assessed intact); Pickaxe Mountain candidate site. TIME: IAEA verification blackout ongoing since 28-FEB-2026 -- Day 113 as of 22-JUN-2026. FDD/ISIS analysis published 09-JUN. IAEA Board resolution 10-JUN. EQUIPMENT: Centrifuge cascades at Fordow and Isfahan assessed operational. HEU stockpile location currently unverifiable. UNIT: AEOI (Atomic Energy Organization of Iran); IRGC site security; IAEA Board of Governors.
Why This Cycle	The US-Iran MOU agreed Sunday 14-JUN explicitly defers HEU disposition to Phase 2 talks and does NOT create IAEA access -- confirmed by Iranian FM Araghchi on the day of agreement. This is the most significant NUC-001 development this cycle: the diplomatic resolution everyone was waiting for arrived, and it leaves the proliferation verification gap entirely intact for at least another 60 days. Saudi Arabia has conditioned Phase 2 nuclear acceptance on IAEA verification guarantees the agency can no longer provide. The structural constraint on the deal's durability is the gap between what the MOU promises (nuclear negotiations) and what exists (no verification mechanism).
Summary	The IAEA verification blackout entered Day 113 with the US-Iran MOU agreed but not yet signed. Iranian FM Araghchi explicitly stated on 14-JUN that the MOU "does not create access" for IAEA inspectors. The 440.9 kg of 60%-enriched HEU last verified by the IAEA on 27-FEB-2026 remains unaccounted -- the MOU defers HEU disposition entirely to Phase 2 talks within a 60-day post-signing window. Trump confirmed in a New York Times interview that the MOU permits Iran low-level enrichment; final enrichment limits and HEU disposal are Phase 2 subjects. The IAEA Board passed a resolution 21-3 on 10-JUN demanding cooperation; Russia, China, and Niger voted against. Fordow underground facility and Isfahan tunnel complex are both assessed as largely intact. Western officials assessed (Bloomberg, 3-JUN) that the risk of covert nuclear weapons pursuit is higher today than before the February 2026 US-Israeli strikes.
Analyst Assessment	PROLIFERATION SIGNIFICANCE: 440.9 kg of 60%-enriched uranium is sufficient fissile material for multiple nuclear weapons if further enriched to 90%+. At 60% the material is already well past the threshold enrichment level and represents the most proliferation-significant HEU stockpile outside declared nuclear weapon states. The verification gap means neither the quantity nor the location of this material can be confirmed by any external party. DEAL LEVERAGE DYNAMIC: The HEU stockpile is Iran's primary negotiating leverage. Surrendering it as the US demands removes that leverage permanently. Iran's down-blend counter-offer preserves the option of re-enrichment and is therefore strategically rational from

Tehran's perspective. This asymmetry is unlikely to resolve without a verification mechanism neither side has demonstrated willingness to create.

MOU SIGNED -- VERIFICATION GAP UNCHANGED: The MOU is now signed and in force. It does not restore IAEA access. The 440.9 kg of 60%-enriched HEU remains unverified and unaccounted. The MOU's own text defers the disposal mechanism to Phase 2 mutual agreement. Until Phase 2 produces a verification framework, the IAEA blackout continues regardless of MOU status. Saudi Arabia has conditioned Phase 2 nuclear acceptance on IAEA verification guarantees the agency can no longer provide -- this is a structural constraint on Phase 2 success independent of US-Iran goodwill.

LIKELIHOOD: Iran maintaining functional enrichment capacity with no IAEA visibility: ALMOST CERTAIN. **CONFIDENCE:** HIGH.

LIKELIHOOD: HEU stockpile surrendered or fully verifiably down-blended within 30 days: ALMOST NO CHANCE. **CONFIDENCE:** HIGH.

LIKELIHOOD: Deal framework includes verifiable IAEA access restoration within 60 days: UNLIKELY. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

ALT HYP

ALT A: Iran covertly down-blended or transferred HEU during blackout as pre-condition signal for deal [unlikely]

Iran offered down-blend in earlier negotiating sessions; some Iranian officials signaled willingness to reduce stockpile optics before a final deal; down-blend removes domestic political liability of visibly holding bomb-grade material during negotiations.

✓ **Supporting Evidence:** No IAEA verification is possible; down-blend offer has been consistently framed as non-binding and non-surrendering; Isfahan tunnel complex assessed as HEU storage site with no observable material drawdown in satellite imagery; historical AEOI pattern is to maximize stockpile during inspection gaps.

✗ **Ruling-Out Evidence:** FDD/ISIS analysis specifically notes the IAEA report is silent on Fordow, Natanz tunnel, and Pickaxe Mountain -- candidate entombment sites where material movement would be hardest to detect.

ALT B: Enrichment activity continued and stockpile has grown beyond the 27-FEB-2026 baseline [roughly even chance]

Fordow and Isfahan underground halls are both assessed as largely intact and operational; 102 days of unmonitored operations provides substantial time for additional enrichment; historical AEOI behavior under inspection gaps is to accelerate production; underground facilities were specifically designed for operational continuity under attack conditions.

✓ **Supporting Evidence:** Active conflict degrades facility staffing, logistics, and power supply; US-Israeli strikes had broad suppressive effect on Iranian nuclear workforce; down-blend offer from Iran signals a desire to reduce the stockpile number if only for optics.

✗ **Ruling-Out Evidence:** No direct evidence of post-28-FEB enrichment activity is accessible to open-source analysis; disruption to Natanz above-ground capacity may have constrained overall output even if underground facilities continued.

Why This Cycle

The Check Point CVE-2026-50751 FCEB remediation deadline PASSED on 11-JUN. Any FCEB agency that has not patched or disconnected affected VPN appliances is now in violation of binding federal cyber policy, and the posture shifts from patch-by-deadline to active threat-hunt for compromise. Microsoft Patch Tuesday (10-JUN) released 200+ CVEs in a single day -- record release -- including 3 zero-days with technical details publicly known before patches were available. RoguePlanet PoC published within hours of Patch Tuesday by Nightmare Eclipse, giving adversaries a working exploit the same day defenders received the patch. The combination of Check Point deadline day plus record Patch Tuesday plus active RoguePlanet PoC creates a high-density defender pressure window. Iran-linked cyber actors maintain confirmed ICS/OT campaign against US critical infrastructure (see CYB-001 prior body). Secure Boot certificate expiration deadline 26-JUN is 15 days away.

Summary	CISA added three new vulnerabilities to the Known Exploited Vulnerabilities catalog on 09-JUN: a Google Chromium V8 out-of-bounds flaw affecting all Chromium-based browsers (due 23-JUN), an Arista EOS network OS incomplete comparison flaw (due 23-JUN), and a Cisco Catalyst SD-WAN Manager output encoding vulnerability (due 23-JUN). The three-sector sweep in one day is consistent with strategic pre-positioning. FCEB agencies that have not patched or disconnected are in violation of binding federal cyber policy as of 11-JUN; this is now an active incident-response posture, not a patch-cycle item. Analyst Assessment	THREE-SECTOR PATTERN: Browser (Chromium V8) plus network OS (Arista EOS) plus SD-WAN management plane (Cisco Catalyst) in a single KEV publishing event covers end-user access, network transit, and remote management simultaneously. This is not the profile of opportunistic criminal exploitation, which typically targets a single high-value vulnerability. The combination is consistent with nation-state pre-positioning to establish persistent access across multiple layers of enterprise architecture before executing a coordinated campaign. GEOPOLITICAL CONTEXT: The active US-Iran military exchange materially elevates the probability that IRGC-nexus or MOIS-affiliated cyber actors are behind some or all of the 09-JUN KEV exploitation activity. Iran has a documented pattern of escalating cyber operations against US critical infrastructure during periods of kinetic confrontation, including the confirmed ICS/OT campaign noted in prior cycles (CISA-FBI-NSA joint advisory April 2026). No attribution has been confirmed by CISA for the 09-JUN entries. Fortinet FortiGuard Labs has identified a substantial increase in cybercriminal activity between January and May 2026 targeting FIFA World Cup 2026 infrastructure. Key findings: 13,000+ FIFA-related domains newly registered (potential phishing/malware delivery); 260 FIFA employee credentials discovered in stealer log data; 270,000+ credentials from users of FIFA-related websites compromised. Canadian Centre for Cyber Security (CCCS) assessment: the FIFA World Cup 2026 "will almost certainly be targeted by a range of cyber threat actors including cybercriminals, non-state actors, and state-sponsored actors." Primary threats: ticket scams and credential harvesting; ransomware against ticketing and transportation infrastructure; Iran-affiliated hacktivist groups (per Rozin Security tactical bulletin 04-JUN and Canadian Cyber Centre advisory); malicious FIFA-related apps delivering malware; DDoS against match-day broadcast and ticketing systems. World Cup runs June 11 - July 19, 2026 across 16 cities in US, Canada, Mexico.

Analyst Assessment

IRAN-SPECIFIC THREAT: Rozin Security and Canadian Cyber Centre both specifically flag Iran-affiliated hacktivist groups as a threat to tournament infrastructure, given the ongoing US-Iran conflict context. Iran-related matches present the highest political motivation for disruption. The "Electronic Operations Room" (formed 28-FEB) coordinating hacktivist operations represents an organized capability that could be directed against tournament infrastructure.

CREDENTIAL COMPROMISE SCALE: 260 FIFA employee credentials in stealer logs represents a pre-positioned access risk. Attackers with legitimate FIFA employee credentials can conduct insider-threat-equivalent operations against tournament systems without triggering external intrusion detection.

OPENING MATCH RISK WINDOW: June 11 opening ceremony and first match represent peak risk: maximum global viewership, highest crowd density at venues, peak media attention, and maximum reputational impact of any disruption. This is the single highest-risk window of the tournament for both physical and cyber incidents.

LIKELIHOOD: Cyber incident targeting World Cup infrastructure in first 7 days of tournament: **LIKELY.** **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

The war remains a standing thread the suite tracks, so the entry is retained at MONITOR / CONTINUED with the score reduced from 15 to 10 rather than carried at HIGH on stale 07-JUN data (Chornobyl strike, E3 summit, Zelenskyy-Putin rejection), all of which were prior-cycle items. If a US-relevant delta emerges (a confirmed US policy or aid change, a NATO-territory incident, or a strike on a US-linked asset) this returns to a scored HIGH entry.

Summary	Russia conducted an overnight drone barrage against Kyiv and Mykolaiv (ISW), consistent with the ongoing pattern of sustained long-range strikes. The diplomatic track remains stalled, with US mediation attention shifted to the Middle East. PSNI is still seeking further suspects. Score reduced 18 to 16. Prior cycle posture was active multi-city escalation with water cannon first deployed.

ESCALATION TRAJECTORY: The 2024 UK riots (Southport, July-August 2024) and the 2025 NI riots (Ballymena, June 2025) both began as localised responses to individual violent incidents involving asylum seekers or migrants and escalated to multi-city disorder within 48-72 hours. The same pattern is active here. The key variable is whether today's Belfast City Hall rally produces additional violence and whether that amplifies beyond Northern Ireland. The joint loyalist-nationalist framing of today's rally is the most important indicator to watch -- if it holds, it signals the anti-immigration frame is overriding the historic sectarian divide, which would represent a significant shift in Northern Irish political dynamics.

IO AMPLIFICATION PATTERN: Musk, Farage, and Robinson were cited by NI officials as key amplifiers within hours of the knife attack. This is the identical pattern documented in the 2024 UK riots, where Musk's X platform posts directly preceded new riot locations. The reach of these accounts is global. Social media platforms have not acted to limit amplification. Expect continued spread of calls for protests in UK cities throughout today.

ICA CONTEXT: The Irish Citizen Army (ICA) -- a new far-right group that has appropriated the name of the 1913 socialist labour militia -- is a background-level presence within the broader ecosystem but is NOT the operational driver of current events. The ICA is under Garda monitoring including involvement of the anti-terror Special Detective Unit. Its splinter group the Irish Defence Army (IDA) had five members arrested in December 2025 for plotting to attack a mosque in Galway and target migrant accommodation. The ICA's online activity uses AI-generated Marvel superhero imagery and is assessed as primarily online and disorganised at this stage. However, the current riot environment provides exactly the conditions under which such groups historically attempt to insert themselves as organisational nodes.

US EQUITIES: US citizens in Belfast, Glasgow, and London should exercise caution and avoid protest areas. The US Embassy demonstration alert is an operational signal: US government personnel are being warned. US-Ireland and US-UK relations are not materially affected. The Sudanese national's asylum route (Paris to Dublin to Northern Ireland) will draw attention to the Common Travel Area and may generate political pressure on the Irish government from the UK. Watch for Taoiseach and Irish government response today.

LIKELIHOOD: Continued nightly disorder in Northern Ireland through the weekend: ROUGHLY EVEN CHANCE. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

LIKELIHOOD: Disorder spreading to additional GB cities within 48 hours: ROUGHLY EVEN CHANCE. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

LIKELIHOOD: ICA or IDA conducting organised action in Republic of Ireland in conjunction with NI disorder: UNLIKELY. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

ALT A: Violence peaks at today's Belfast City Hall rally then de-escalates over 48-72 hrs consistent with prior NI riot cycles [roughly even chance]

Prior NI riot cycles (2024, 2025, 2021) typically peaked in the first 48-72 hours; PSNI has substantial experience managing anti-immigration disorder; victim's family has called for calm; counter-protests and community leaders are active; NI Secretary Benn is making public statements.

✓ **Supporting Evidence:** PSNI has deployed riot units; Government of UK and NI are making statements; community response in prior cycles was effective; the loyalist-nationalist joint framing may not hold if nationalist communities decline to participate.

✗ **Ruling-Out Evidence:** Today's City Hall rally has not occurred yet; joint loyalist-nationalist framing, if it holds, would be a structural escalation beyond prior cycles.

ALT B: Joint loyalist-nationalist rally holds today; disorder spreads beyond Northern Ireland; multi-city unrest comparable to 2024 UK riots develops within 48-72 hrs [roughly even chance]

IO amplification pattern is identical to 2024 UK riots; Musk and Robinson reach is global; 2024 riots spread from Southport to 30+ English cities in 72 hours; anniversary timing (exactly 1 year after 2025 Ballymena riots) is psychologically significant; fuel protest networks and anti-immigration protest networks across Ireland and GB are primed.

✓ **Supporting Evidence:** Counter-protests consistently outnumbered far-right protesters in 2024; UK government rapid prosecution was effective deterrent; NI political leadership is bipartisan in condemning the violence; community resilience in Belfast is high after decades of managing disorder.

✗ **Ruling-Out Evidence:** The loyalist-nationalist joint framing is the key unknown -- if it fractures on sectarian lines it limits spread; PSNI surge capacity is operational.

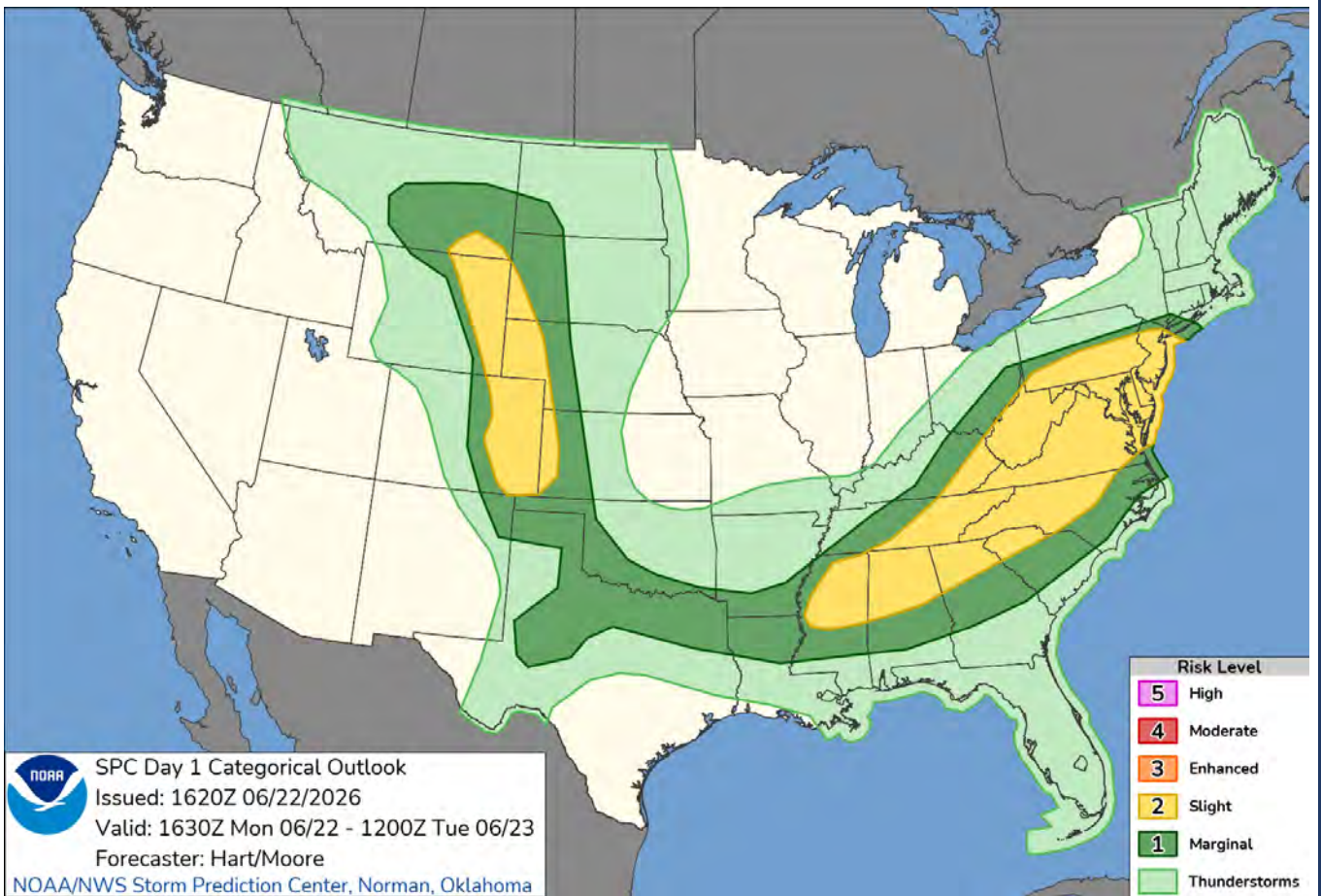

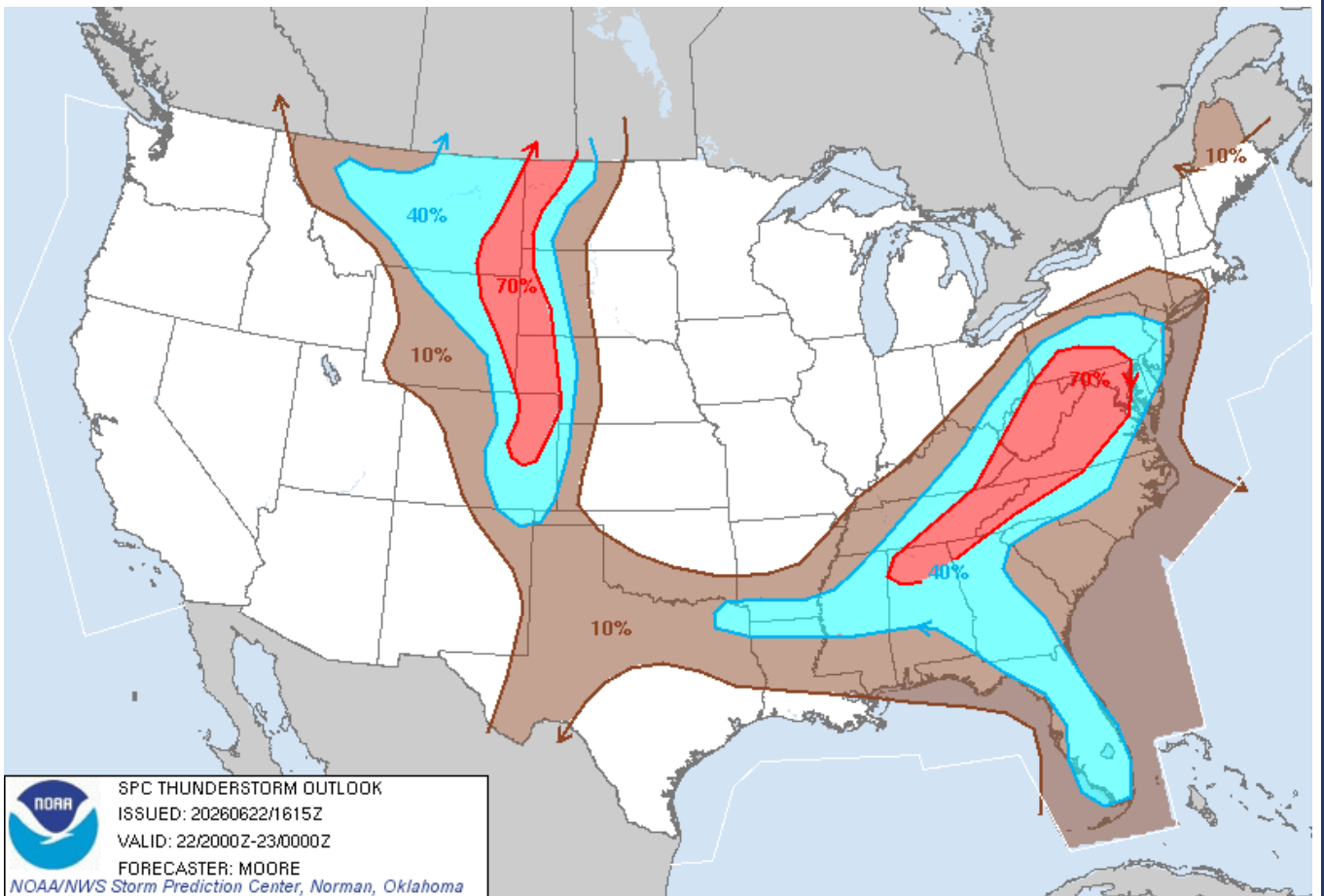

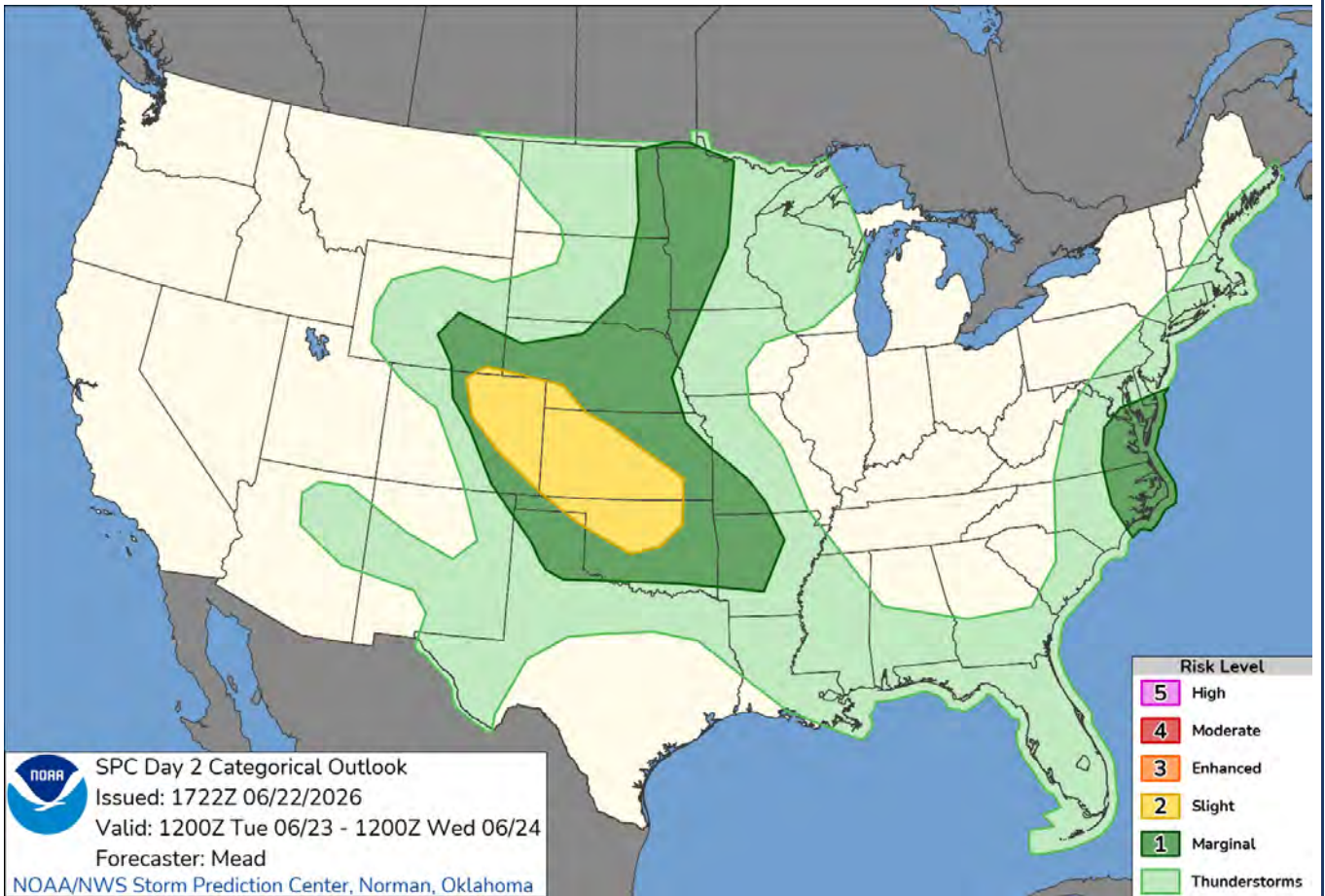

Arthur Aftermath Summary

Tropical Storm Arthur formed 17-JUN Gulf of Mexico, made landfall TX coast near Galveston (sustained 40 mph), downgraded post-tropical same night. Remnants drove catastrophic flooding 18-JUN across LA/MS. Louisiana: Gov. Landry statewide emergency; Avoyelles Parish 200+ homes flooded; Cottonport 31+ inches over 5 days; West Esplanade Ave canal (Kenner/New Orleans area) overtopped. Mississippi: 1 road crew worker killed during cleanup operations; multiple water rescues; Anchor Lake Dam NOT breached (earlier NWS report of failure incorrect). National Guard and state wildlife officials conducting rescues. As of 19-JUN morning, remnants tracking NE through FL into Carolinas. Level 4/4 WPC ERO active through early morning 19-JUN. PDS Flash Flood Watch expired 0600Z 19-JUN.

Analyst Assessment

TODAY'S THREAT CHARACTER: The Day 1 Marginal covers a wide geographic swath from TX to FL to the Carolinas -- all driven by Arthur remnant moisture. This is not organized supercell territory today; the primary risks are locally damaging wind gusts from pulse storms in the moist tropical air mass and residual flood potential as ground saturation remains extreme across LA/MS. MN/WI hail risk is isolated. Florida is the most energetic area (PWAT 2.00"+, CAPE, midlevel lapse rates 6.5-7.0 C/km) and could see robust downburst-producing storms. Day 2 ENHANCED Central Plains is the more significant threat this cycle -- supercell outbreak potential Saturday warrants preparedness now.

WORLD CUP VENUE WEATHER TODAY (19-JUN): Seattle (USA vs Australia, 1900Z): no significant weather threat -- Pacific marine layer; mild. Boston (Scotland vs Morocco, 2200Z): no significant weather threat. Philadelphia (Brazil vs Haiti, 0100Z 20-JUN): Arthur remnant moisture possible, monitor for convection. Santa Clara (Turkey vs Paraguay, 0300Z 20-JUN): no significant weather threat. TOMORROW (20-JUN): Central Plains ENHANCED risk -- no World Cup matches in affected zone. NWR gap note: CA-Los

Angeles KWO37 OOS is new this cycle -- affects SoFi/Inglewood corridor where Iran plays Belgium 21-JUN.

FIRE WEATHER TODAY AND TOMORROW: Day 1 Fire Weather: CRITICAL for far northern CA + extreme southern OR + NW Nevada. Broad upper troughing over Interior West promotes surface low development over Great Basin; dry southwesterly surface flow; 15-20 mph winds; RH 10-15%; dry thunderstorm lightning risk (high-based storms over N Sierra tracking toward SE OR/N Great Basin). ERCs at 80-90th percentile -- efficient lightning-induced ignitions expected. Day 2 Fire Weather: CRITICAL for Four Corners region -- near single-digit RH, 15-20 mph WSW winds; some guidance shows 20+ mph and single-digit RH for several hours. Elevated Pacific Northwest (dry/breezy Cascade lee). Multiple named active fires: South Fork NE (CIMT, evacuations), Shore CA (structures threatened), Mateo CA (Camp Pendleton, chaparral). 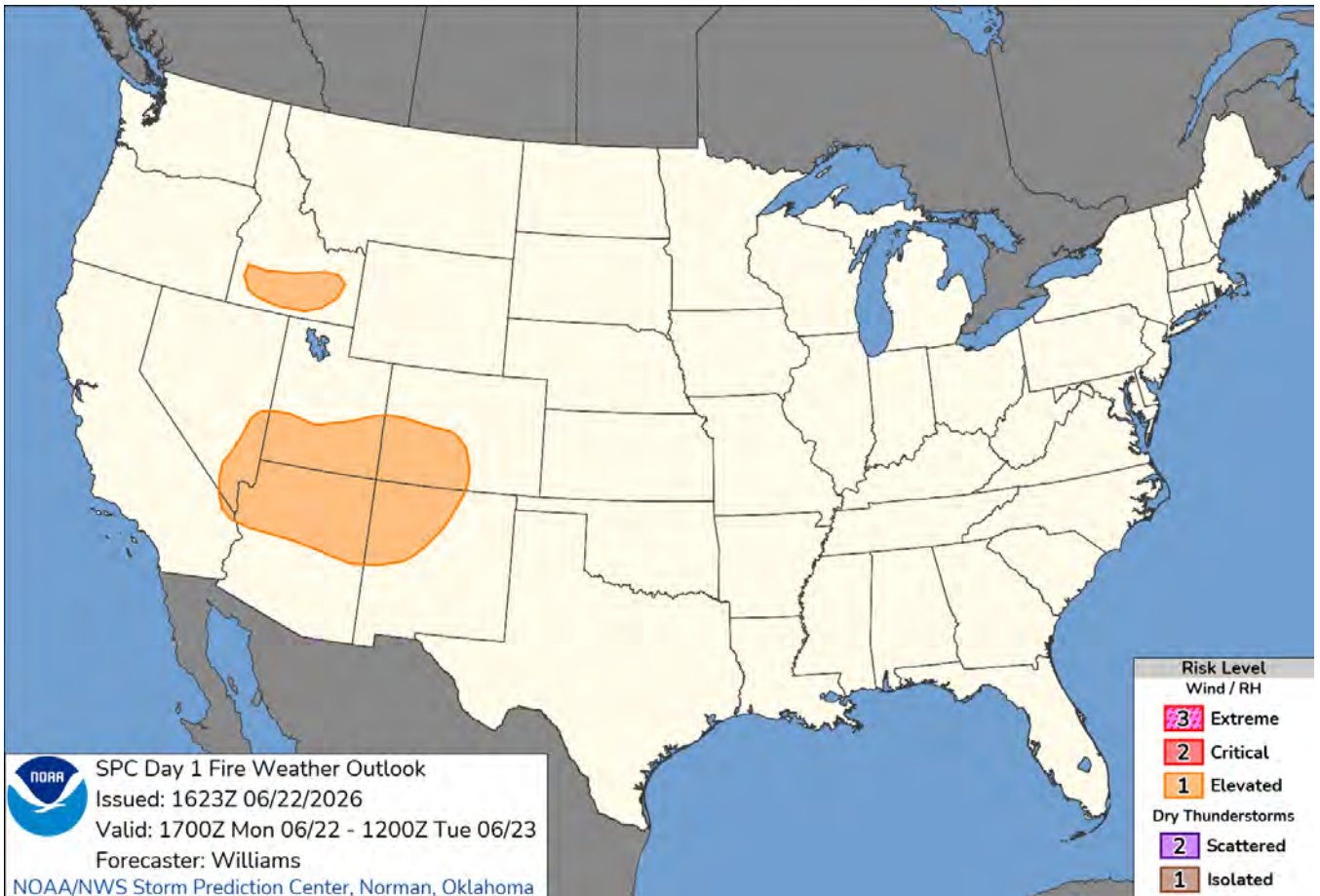

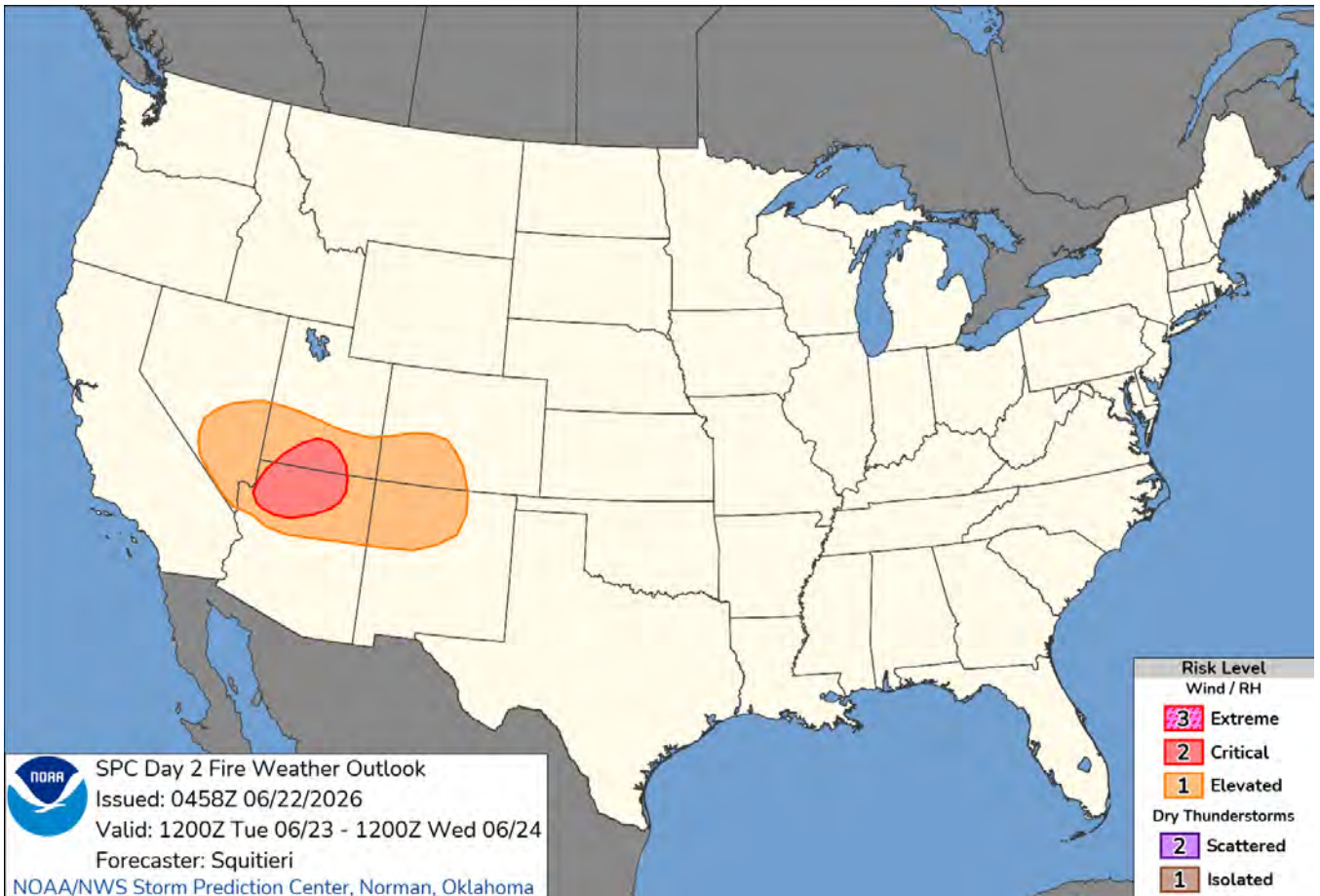
SPC Fire Weather Day 1

SPC Day 1 Fire Weather Outlook (valid 151200Z-161200Z, issued 0144 AM CDT 16-JUN-2026): Between a large-scale trough encompassing the eastern two-thirds of the CONUS and an upper ridge over the West, a robust midlevel speed max will overspread the northern/central Plains during the day. Along/behind the cold front/surface trough, ample diurnal heating will result in a well-mixed boundary layer with 15-20 percent RH expected across parts of eastern Wyoming into the Nebraska Panhandle and vicinity. Enhanced low/midlevel flow along the periphery of the passing speed max and tightening pressure gradient will result in 15-25 mph sustained northwesterly surface winds -- elevated to locally critical fire-weather conditions. Additionally, strong terrain-driven winds (15-20 mph, locally greater in gap-flow areas) and 10-15 percent RH will promote locally elevated fire weather conditions across parts of the eastern Great Basin, Four Corners, and Central Rockies. SPC Day 2 Fire Weather Outlook (valid 161200Z-171200Z, issued 0144 AM CDT 16-JUN-2026): Along the northeastern periphery of an upper ridge, a midlevel trough and accompanying 70-80-kt speed max will advance southeastward across the Northwest and northern Rockies on Tuesday. NORTHERN INTERMOUNTAIN WEST (elevated to locally critical): strong deep-layer west-northwesterly flow with 15-25 mph sustained westerly surface winds amid 15-20 percent afternoon RH over increasingly dry/receptive fuels. Locally critical conditions most likely in gap-flow areas through the Cascades and Snake River Plain. EASTERN GREAT BASIN INTO THE ROCKIES AND ADJACENT PLAINS (broadly elevated): breezy/gusty west-northwesterly surface winds with single-digit to lower-teens RH yield broad elevated fire-weather conditions. Active Fire Areas (14-JUN IMSR / InciWeb)

NEBRASKA: South Fork Fire (Soldier Creek Wilderness, Nebraska National Forest, Pine Ridge RD): ignited 09-JUN; evacuation orders and closures in effect; Rocky Mountain Complex IMT committed. Most significant new-evacuation incident this cycle.

NEW MEXICO: Seven Cabins Fire (Lincoln NF, 13 mi NE of Capitan): minimal fire behavior, smoldering; numerous structures threatened; area/road/trail closures; complex IMT. Bear Fire (Gila NF, 18 mi SE of Quemado): ~150 acres, running/flanking/spotting, structures threatened. NM triple-gap NWR (Artesia WXN24 / Roswell WWG36 / Carlsbad WWF37 all OOS) leaves Chaves and Eddy counties without primary NWR alerting during active fire season.

SOUTHWEST AREA (SWCC most active GACC): 3 fires, 38,632 cumulative acres, 671 personnel. Today's Day 1 fire weather conditions (elevated-to-critical WY/NE Panhandle; elevated Great Basin/Four Corners) apply directly to this GACC's active fire country.

ALASKA: Multiple fires in the Galena Zone (BLM) area including Kopshesut; structures threatened. SE Alaska: 12 Juneau-cluster NWR transmitters DEGRADED further compounds wildfire alerting in AK.

Analyst Assessment

SEASON TRAJECTORY: At 195% of the 10-year average for acres burned with NPL at 2 of 5, the 2026 fire season is running significantly above historical norms. Sustained drought across the Southeast (99% in drought) and Southwest, combined with above-normal temperatures, supports continued elevated risk. The season peak in the Rocky Mountain and Pacific Northwest regions typically arrives July-August; current indicators suggest that peak may arrive earlier or with greater intensity.

IPAWS/NWR GAPS IN FIRE COUNTRY: The NM triple-gap NWR outage (all three transmitters covering Chaves/Eddy/Lincoln counties OOS) is specifically notable given

Seven Cabins Fire activity in Lincoln County and active fire restrictions. Residents and firefighting operations in this area must rely on WEA mobile alerts, FEMA App, and radio broadcast EAS exclusively.

DRY-THUNDERSTORM IGNITION WATCH: The Day 2 (13-JUN) SPC Fire Weather highlights mostly dry, high-based thunderstorms over the southern/eastern Great Basin into the central Rockies, with inverted-V soundings favoring strong/erratic outflow gusts and lightning ignitions on critically dry fuels. This is the primary new-start mechanism to watch over the next 48 hours, layered on the elevated-to-critical Day 1 conditions already present across the eastern Great Basin and central Rockies.

LIKELIHOOD: New fire starts in the eastern Great Basin / central Rockies critical-fuel zone over the next 48 hours: LIKELY. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

LIKELIHOOD: National Preparedness Level escalation to NPL 3 before end of June: ROUGHLY EVEN CHANCE. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.

The electron flux event began 13-JUN and is now on Day 6 of continuous elevated readings above 1000 pfu at GOES-19. The prior 27-day forecast window endpoint (18-JUN) has passed; the new Serial 3703 extends the alert with no cancellation indicated. No new geomagnetic or

	proton events have emerged. The concern this cycle remains satellite charging and surface charging risk for spacecraft at geosynchronous orbit -- no direct HF or GNSS degradation reported.
Summary	ALTEF3 Serial 3703 (18-JUN 1507 UTC, GOES-19): Electron 2MeV integral flux exceeded 1000 pfu continuously since 13-JUN 1332 UTC. This is a radiation belt electron enhancement event -- electrons accelerated in the outer radiation belt. Primary operational impact is on spacecraft at geosynchronous orbit (surface charging, deep dielectric charging). No associated geomagnetic storm is currently active. No solar proton event. Analyst Assessment

COMPOUNDING STRUCTURE: The combination of drought, above-average fire season, Hormuz-driven fertilizer cost increases, and elevated fuel costs (transportation and mechanized agriculture) creates a structural compounding risk to 2026 harvest projections that will not resolve within this cycle.

SOUTHEAST DROUGHT SEVERITY: The SE drought at record levels (records to 1895) for the Sep 2025 - Mar 2026 period represents an exceptional multi-month agricultural disruption. Combined with reduced NWR coverage across the Southeast (NC Ellerbe OOS, GA Baxley OOS), the region has compound infrastructure and informational gaps.

GLOBAL FOOD SECURITY TRAJECTORY: The WFP March forecast that 45 million people could become acutely food insecure if oil prices remain ~\$100/bbl through June is now unfolding. Brent has remained above \$100/bbl for the entire period since April. The food security impact of the Hormuz crisis will lag the energy impact by months.

Six simultaneous indicator-based triggers firing: (1) Ebola PHEIC Day 38 -- no vaccine, 20%+ HCW case rate; (2) BOD 26-04/CISA warnings -- Splunk actively exploited, FortiBleed advisory, 10+ KEVs overdue; (3) 31 NWR OOS/DEGRADED, GNSS sustained denial 21 clusters, M6.8 flare possible CME; (4) GPS/GNSS denial campaign -- 21 confirmed AIS jamming clusters, Baltic Russian EKS spoofing; (5) War Powers/CENTCOM active -- Op Epic Fury Day 115; (6) Active severe weather -- EF2 fatality KS 21-JUN, IL/IN fatalities 21-JUN, SLIGHT risk today. PREP-CON 2 not warranted: no imminent comms disruption, no martial law, no rapid currency devaluation. PREP-CON 4 would understate the multi-vector picture. Remaining triggers still met at Possible tier: (1) active KEV exploitation including KEV deadline TODAY (Oracle PeopleSoft), Ivanti deadline passed 14-JUN, Check Point overdue; (2) World Cup mass-gathering open; (3) MARAD 2026-008 active (Hormuz maritime risk remains HIGH pre-signing); (4) G7 summit opens today with confirmed Black Bloc protest activity in Geneva; (5) Iran vs NZ in LA tonight with protests and extra security. SUPPORTS STAYING AT 4 (today): Unsigned deal, Lebanon volatile, active KEV exploitation, World Cup Day 6, G7 protests, Iran vs NZ tonight. All Possible-tier triggers remain active. ORANGE SKY is the correct posture until signature confirms and Lebanon stabilizes.

SUPPORTS MOVING BACK TO 3: If MOU collapses (Lebanon IDF-Hezbollah exchange escalates), or confirmed CONUS comms degradation (COMCON move to 3), or confirmed cyber attack on critical infrastructure -- none currently met.

LIKELIHOOD: MOU signed 19-JUN and PREP-CON step down to 5 by end of week: ROUGHLY EVEN CHANCE. **CONFIDENCE:** MODERATE.
