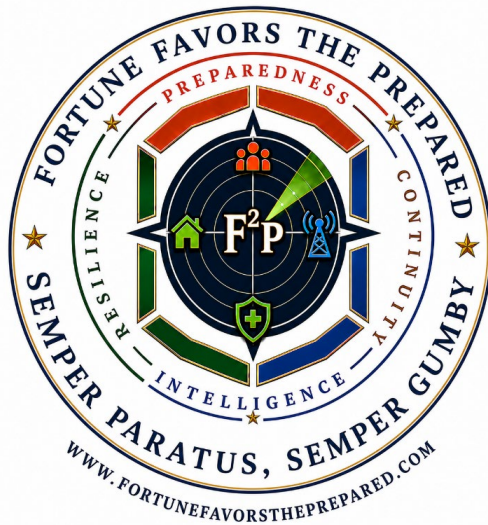

This reference is for the designated MAG Vetting Officer only. No single indicator here is sufficient for a finding. Document exactly what you observe on WS-1 Section 6. Assess in totality. Probe in the interview. A finding that cannot survive cross-referencing is not a finding. Every symbol with a legitimate use noted is assessed only in the context of the candidate's full profile.

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

Use during OSINT review of photographs, social media, and forum content, and during in-person observation. When you identify an indicator, record the exact observation on WS-1 Section 6 — describe what you see, not what you conclude. For symbols that have documented legitimate uses, record the candidate's stated explanation and probe it in the interview. A credible explanation reduces significance; an implausible one increases it.

The 'Legitimate Use' column contains what a non-extremist person might plausibly say when asked. It is a probe tool, not a get-out-of-jail-free card. Assess: does the candidate's explanation match their broader profile?

SECTION 1

Tattoo Placement: Significance by Body Location

Location	Documented Significance	Document When...
Face / neck	High commitment marker. Visible in all professional and social contexts. Only worn by those who accept permanent public identification. Teardrops, numbers, dots, and set names here = deep organizational commitment.	Any tattoo on face or neck regardless of design.
Right / left hand, knuckles	Earned-status markers in many gang cultures. 'HATE/LOVE' across knuckles has roots in WS prison culture and general outlaw subculture. ACAB (All Cops Are Bastards) across knuckles = anti-law-enforcement identity.	Knuckle text, numbers, letter blocks, or symbol tattoos.
Chest / sternum	Most personally significant affiliations. Where members put their primary identity: set name, founding date, memorial imagery for deceased members, large organizational symbols.	Large text, numerics, or symbols referencing organizations.
Forearm (inner)	Daily-visible placement = intentional public display. Numbers, dots, crowns, pitchforks, or text placed here are meant to be seen.	Any symbol from this guide at this location.
Back	Reserved for major organizational imagery: cityscapes, patron saints, large set names, complex compositions. Back pieces are earned markings.	Any large organizational or symbolic design.
Elbow	Spider web centered on elbow = time served in prison or WS prison gang affiliation in many regions. Not decorative in prison culture.	Spider web centered on elbow specifically.
Back of neck	Spider web or web-adjacent = imprisonment or criminal experience. Also used for SS-style imagery in WN contexts.	Spider web or web-adjacent design at back of neck.
Teardrop (below eye)	Multiple meanings: loss of associate, time served, or confirmed killing. Single filled teardrop often = murder. Outline = attempted murder or mourning. Probe context in interview.	Any teardrop tattoo on face.

SECTION 2

Prison Tattoos: Universal Indicators

Prison tattoos are not gang-specific. They communicate criminal history, status within the criminal hierarchy, and time served. Most are created with improvised equipment (modified electric razors, paper clips, guitar strings) using soot, melted plastic, or pen ink — the quality is characteristically rough and often monochromatic. Presence does not confirm prison time; absence does not confirm its absence.

SECTION 3

Street Gang: Tattoo, Numeric, and Color Indicators

Numbers are the most portable and durable gang identifiers — they appear in tattoos, usernames, captions, and bios across platforms. A number alone is a data point. A number combined with color displays, hand signs, consistent companions, and additional symbols is a pattern.

Color context: street gang color affiliation is worn consistently — in clothing, accessories, and group photos. Isolated color use is not a finding. Pattern across many photos and contexts is.

 Five Dots Five-dot pattern typically between thumb and forefinger. 'Mi vida loca' or prison time. Common in Latino gang and Mexican Mafia contexts. In France, 'a man between four walls.' ✓ Legit use: General tattoo or dice imagery — assess context and location.	 Three Dots Three-dot triangle. 'Mi vida loca.' Small hand or neck tattoo. Also used in European prison culture meaning 'see/hear/say nothing' (no snitching). ✓ Legit use: General tattoo — probe for meaning.	 Teardrop (Diamond) Loss of associate, time served, or murder. Filled = completed act. Outline = attempted or mourning. High-significance face tattoo. ✓ Legit use: None — face tattoo alone is significant.	 5-Point Crown Latin Kings primary identifier. SECTION 4

Outlaw Motorcycle Club (OMC) Symbols

OMC symbols are universal across all clubs. A three-piece patch (rocker-logo-rocker) is the most definitive indicator of active membership. Support gear (club-branded without the center patch) signals a formal relationship with the club.

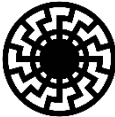

SECTION 5

White Nationalist & Neo-Nazi Symbols — With Legitimate Use Assessment

CONTEXT REQUIRED — CRITICAL READ

Every symbol in this section has been co-opted by WN/neo-Nazi movements from older Norse, runic, or European heritage traditions. The legitimate uses column reflects what a non-extremist person might genuinely say. Assess: (1) Is the candidate's explanation specific and accurate? (2) Does it match their broader profile — Norse pagan practice, heathen faith, Scandinavian heritage? (3) Do multiple indicators appear together? A single rune on a Scandinavian-heritage pagan = data point. The same rune on a candidate who also displays 88 numerics, follows WN channels, and uses coded language = a finding.

SECTION 6

Sovereign Citizen Movement — Comprehensive Indicators

FBI DOMESTIC TERRORISM DESIGNATION

The FBI classifies sovereign citizen extremists as domestic terrorists. Law enforcement surveys 2014–2015 ranked SovCit risk HIGHER than any other domestic group. Between March–August 2024 alone, SovCits shot six officers (one killed). Terry Nichols, Oklahoma City bombing co-conspirator, was a SovCit adherent. Operational incompatibility with a lawful MAG is absolute.

Sovereign citizens believe they exist outside U.S. legal jurisdiction due to special knowledge, heritage, or procedural arguments. The movement has no single leader or organization — members connect through seminars, social media, and online communities. A growing variant, American State Nationals (ASNs), rejects the 'sovereign citizen' label but holds identical beliefs. Moorish sovereign citizens (often Black Americans) make similar claims based on a 1787 US-Morocco treaty, which contains no such provisions.

QAnon / SovCit overlap	Significant overlap in beliefs. 'The government is illegitimate,' 'there are hidden legal remedies,' 'common law grand juries can indict.'	Assess for QAnon beliefs during general motivation/political discussion.

6C — PAPER TERRORISM INDICATORS

'Paper terrorism' refers to SovCit tactics of filing fraudulent legal documents to harass, intimidate, or damage credit. It is a federal crime (18 U.S.C. § 1001). Candidates who describe filing liens, common law indictments, or UCC filings against officials are describing criminal activity.

Paper Terrorism Tactic	What It Is	MAG Risk Implication
False UCC liens against officials	Filing liens on property of judges, police, officials who ruled against them.	Candidate may do this to MAG leadership if they feel wronged.
'Common law grand jury' filings	Convening fake grand juries that issue fraudulent indictments.	Candidate may attempt this against group members.
Fake 'arrest warrants' for officials	Issuing fake legal documents demanding arrest of officials.	Criminal behavior — operational incompatibility.
Frivolous lawsuits (dozens filed)	Filing lawsuits in multiple courts to overwhelm opponents.	Pattern of conflict and harassment in candidate's past.
Quantum Grammar / Parse-Syntax-Grammar filings	David Wynn Miller's pseudo-language — courts have called it 'nonsense' and 'gobbledygook.'	Candidate is deeply embedded — this is advanced SovCit ideology.

SECTION 7

Left-Wing, Anarchist & Anti-Establishment Symbols

CONTEXT AND PROPORTIONALITY — READ BEFORE USING THIS SECTION

Left-wing symbols span a wide spectrum from mainstream political participation to advocacy of political violence. Presence of symbols in this section is assessed on the same standard as all other indicators: content, associations, and stated intent — not ideology alone. A candidate who attends protests or identifies as anti-fascist is not disqualifying. A candidate who advocates property destruction, participates in organized political violence, or is deeply embedded in cells that reject any lawful structure is a different matter. Assess the totality.

7A — ANTIFA AND ANTI-FASCIST SYMBOLS

Antifa is a decentralized movement, not a formal organization. It has no membership, no leadership, no central command. Symbols are adopted loosely and their meaning shifts by individual. The presence of antifa symbols indicates anti-fascist political identity — it does not indicate organizational membership because no organization exists to join. Assess: what specific activities has the candidate engaged in?

7B — ANTI-GOVERNMENT / ANTI-ESTABLISHMENT GROUPS

The following groups and affiliations represent anti-government sentiment across the political spectrum. For a MAG, the key operational question is not ideology but lawfulness: does the candidate operate within legal frameworks, or do they reject them? Sovereign citizens (Section 6) are the clearest example of legal framework rejection. The groups below are assessed on activity, not belief.

Group / Movement	Identifiers	MAG Risk Assessment
Three Percenters (III%)	Roman numeral 'III' logo, 'Three Percent' or '3%' in bios, username, patches. Often on apparel.	Loosely organized constitutional militia movement. Spectrum: mainstream gun-rights advocacy to active paramilitary. Assess: what does the candidate believe the group is for? Lawful defense or offensive action against government?
Oath Keepers	'OK' logo, military-style unit structure, organized around refusing 'unconstitutional orders.'	Post-January 6 federal prosecutions of leadership. Active membership in organized formations is a significant risk indicator. Assess depth of involvement.
Proud Boys	'RWDS' (Right Wing Death Squad), 'Stand Back Stand By,' Proud Boys patches, Fraternal Order of Alt-Knights (FOAK).	DHS/FBI documented involvement in political violence. Degree-based membership structure. Assess: what degree did candidate attain and what does that require?
Boogaloo Movement	Hawaiian shirt ('the Big Luau'), 'boog,' igloo emoji, American flag with igloo. Accelerationist variant wants to trigger civil war.	FBI has arrested Boogaloo members for violence and plotting attacks. Accelerationist framing = disqualifying.
Militia Movement (generic)	Unit designations ('X County Militia,' '1st Patriot Guard'), military-style ranks, camouflage group photos.	Wide spectrum. Lawful gun clubs to organized paramilitary training for offensive action. Assess: does the unit have a command structure? Does it plan offensive operations?
QAnon	'Q,' 'WWG1WGA' (Where We Go One We Go All), 'The Great Awakening,' 'Trust the Plan,' 'NCSWIC.'	Significant overlap with sovereign citizen movement. Conspiracy framework that can motivate targeted violence ('doing your own research'). Assess depth of belief and whether it motivates the candidate to take action.
NFAC (Not F***ing Around Coalition)	All-black tactical gear in formations, NFAC patches, leadership reference to 'Grand Master Jay.'	Black nationalist armed group. Leader has advocated for Black separatism. Assess: does membership indicate participation in armed formation or just political support?



Group / Movement	Identifiers	MAG Risk Assessment
Baedan / Queer Nihilist	Anarchist nihilist tendency rejecting all identity categories including queer ones. Very niche.	Rarely relevant to MAG context. Included for completeness.
Eco-Terrorism networks (ELF/ALF)	Earth Liberation Front or Animal Liberation Front communiqués, 'monkeywrenching' references, cell structure language.	FBI has classified ELF/ALF as domestic terrorist organizations. Cell structure + property destruction history = significant operational risk.

7C — PROBE FRAMEWORK FOR POLITICAL EXTREMISM (ANY DIRECTION)

The following questions apply regardless of political direction. They are designed to surface the candidate's actual relationship with political violence and lawfulness — the two factors that matter for MAG operational security.

Question	What You're Listening For
What does 'preparedness' mean to you — are you preparing for natural disaster, social unrest, or something else?	Vague or concerning: 'the coming collapse,' 'what the government will do,' 'the war.' Specific and reasonable: 'storms, job loss, medical.'
Do you believe the current U.S. government is legitimate?	SovCit, anarchist, or accelerationist framing if no. Assess how far they go: skepticism vs. active rejection.
Have you ever participated in a protest, demonstration, or group action?	Note: type, frequency, and role. Peaceful attendance ≠ concern. Arrest, black bloc participation, or leadership role = note.
Is there a scenario where you would take action against a government official or institution?	Listen carefully. 'Lawful self-defense' is acceptable. 'Yes, when the time comes' or 'they had it coming' = significant.
Have you ever been asked to do something by a political group that you thought might be illegal?	Compliance or refusal? How did they describe it?
What do you think of the January 6 events?	Not a political litmus test — listen for: advocacy of political violence, belief that violence was justified, planning for future similar action.

Use this card during OSINT review to log indicators. A single indicator is a data point. Assess patterns. The more independent sources confirm an indicator, the stronger the finding.

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This reference is a living document. Indicator significance evolves as groups adopt and abandon symbols. Always cross-reference current findings against current FBI NGIC threat assessments and ADL Hate Symbols Database before finalizing any finding based on this reference alone.
